### Lord, What Do You Want To Do Through Me?





## our ministry expansion

To honor our past and welcome our future, St. John's Church family seeks to provide a more inviting and accessible center for worship, fellowship and ministry that will offer a greater opportunity to expand our mission and enrich the lives of our members and community.

St. John's is holy ground. It is a place where we have welcomed all people to God's table for 162 years. It is a place where we have baptized our young, solemnized rites of marriage, and buried our dead. It is a place where the faith of our fathers and mothers is handed to us. It is a place that supports our Jubilee Ministries, integrating advocacy, empowerment, evangelism, and outreach into church life. It is holy ground.

Today, we imagine even greater possibilities and promise for our holy ground.



### Welcoming

A two-story, all-glass design, enclosing the area between the Parish Hall and church, with an entrance visible from the street, will allow us to warmly welcome guests, display information, and greet one another before and after services.

### Gathering & Rememberance

### Courtyard

Our courtyard has been a hub of fellowship, hosting picnics, Easter egg hunts, weddings, and other celebrations. However, its current condition is hazardous. Seat walls and gardens will rejuvenate this beautiful outdoor space, while soil removal outside the lower-level Sunday School rooms will reduce moisture-related problems. A permanent labyrinth (funded by a memorial gift) will provide space for contemplation and spiritual healing for the entire neighborhood.

### Columbarium

All remaining niches in our columbarium have been reserved. New niches, inside and outside the new building, will allow us to honor and remember generations to come.

### Accessibility

A five-level elevator and a ramp parallel to Chestnut Street will make it easy for people with physical limitations to access our worship space, auditorium, lower-level classrooms, courtyard, and all-purpose building to joyfully engage in all aspects of parish life.

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### What is the cost of the project?

Our preliminary design has been estimated at \$1.2 to \$1.5 million. More precise costs will be available after construction bids are secured.

### What is the campaign goal?

To raise \$1.2 million over a three-year campaign. Our feasibility study indicated we could raise \$650,000 to \$750,000. We hope to encourage all of our parishioners to pray, "Lord, what do You want to do through me.?"

### How will we pay for this and will we incur debt?

Our plan is to allow the campaign to raise the majority of the required funding, recognizing that a short-term loan may be required to provide cash flow to cover initial building costs. Based on the pledges received, Vestry will determine the scope and other project logistics moving forward. We pray that the Holy Spirit is working in the hearts of all St. John's members, calling each of us to make a sacrificial gift that will enable us to proceed with very little debt.

### When will the project begin?

We plan to break ground within six to 12 months of Commitment Sunday, November 15.

### What percentage of our congregation is able to contribute?

Our feasibility study indicates 79% of those interviewed expressed a willingness to commit to the project.

### How soon will we see more detailed drawings of the capital campaign project?

The architects will produce detailed plans and detailed drawings, with projected cost estimates, in November 2015.

### What about my Annual pledge?

Our Annual pledge is separate from our Capital Campaign pledge. Our Annual pledge is critical to the funding of our ministries. We continue to pray for support to increase the funding of our ongoing ministries. If a choice must be made between the two, we ask that resources be focused on the Annual pledge first.

### How do I know how much my gift should be?

Everyone's situation is different. We hope every decision will be grounded in gratitude, revealed through prayer and lived in faith.

### When are pledge cards due and how do I make payments?

We will be receiving pledge cards on November 15. People are encouraged to kick off their giving to the capital campaign on First Fruits Sunday, December 6. You can then give in whatever way best fits your personal situation. You may choose to give weekly, monthly, annually or as a one-time gift. The choice is yours!

### Can I give in ways other than cash?

Yes! Gifts of appreciated assets, stocks, and other non-cash gifts are described in a brochure you will receive with the pledge cards.

### Might I simply increase my Annual pledge in order to support this initiative?

Supporting the growth of our ministries by increasing your Annual pledge, which supports our operating budget will be welcomed and celebrated. Your gift to the Capital Campaign is a separate gift - going over and above - strengthening our ministries by making improvements to our sacred ground.

### What are you asking of me right now?

We ask only that you join the journey of gratitude, prayer and faith, praying: "Lord, what do You want to do through me?"
