“DON'T STOP THE MUSIC”

(Of Mission and Ministry at St. John's)

“Don't Stop the Music” is the title of a pop song by the music diva, Rihanna. The song celebrates the excitement of being caught up in the feeling and emotion of music, so much so that we want it to never end.

The same can be said about our mission and ministries at St. John's. The summer months have been non stop and our plans for the fall are all fast forward.

We kick off our new season with **EDUCATION SUNDAY** on September 8th with the commissioning of our Nursery Volunteers, Church School Teachers and Journey to Adulthood Leaders. A Parish Pot Luck Picnic in the Courtyard will follow the 10:15 AM service. **MUSIC SUNDAY** with the commissioning of the Chancel Choir and Handbell Ringers will be September 15th and will include exceptional Bach organ prelude and postlude plus hymn selection by Charles and Samuel Wesley. September 22nd will be **PILGRIM SUNDAY** when our Journey to Adulthood teens and leaders offer an audio-visual presentation of their experience of pilgrimage in England. On September 29th we will celebrate **ALTAR GUILD SUNDAY** with special recognition for the sixteen members of our Altar Guild who each Sunday offer to God a service unseen by most of us.

All of this is an expression of the truly exciting ministries we have to offer at St. John's. If you want to serve, St. John's is your church. If you want to observe, that's part of our ministry, too. We don't always have to be “out on the dance floor”. The important part is to hear the music of Christ's mission, feel the Spirit moving, and let the Lord lead you in the sharing of your faith.

St. John's is a parish where the music of mission does not stop. While it was once the custom of churches to “take a break” over the summer, at St. John's ours is a twelve month ministry. Just to name some of our summer ministries: worship for Diocesan Convention, Courtyard planning and parish Mini-Meetings, special Summer Sunday Music offerings, Clothing Drive for children in the Philippines, Vacation Bible School with kick off picnic and VBS Sunday, Blueberry Festival, new St. John's website, Journey to Adulthood Pilgrimage to England, and back to school brunch for the teachers and staff of Fulton Elementary School. You may call this our Slow season at St. John's but all seasons of mission are on Go at St. John's.

This is the quality of mission and ministry that you are invited to share in and support. St. John's is blessed to be a parish that is rich in both resources and in opportunities to serve. We are a source of leadership for ministry in Lancaster city and county and throughout the diocese of Central Pennsylvania, and through the ministries of our Millennium Development Goals we are touching the live of those in need around the world.

Even if you have been away this summer (and I hope you have), St. John's has continued to be here offering an active presence of Christ in our parish, our community and beyond. At St. John's there is always room on the dance floor of service and we never stop music of mission and ministry.

There is nothing quite like the start of the new school year. New teachers, new friends, new ways of knowing... and all the requisite stress! With forms to fill out, rides to coordinate and schedules to manage, the start of a school year is simultaneously exciting and exhausting. By the time the weekend arrives, most of us want to unwind- if not crash. Instead, we balance our precious family time with sports and errands and all the endless lists of things we hope to one day accomplish around the house. Adding one more commitment to an already overburdened calendar can feel overwhelming and stressful.

But there is one weekly event that is too good to miss. A weekly event that both revives and restores: Sunday mornings at St. John's. Registration for Church School** (Pre-K – 7th) will begin in the auditorium at 9:00 a.m. At 9:05, Paul Reese will join us for "Gathering Time", a special lesson featuring music and kid-friendly theology. Classes will immediately follow at 9:15 a.m. Teachers will be available to help children find their classrooms.

Registration for the J2A program (teens in grades 8-12) will begin in the church at 9:15 a.m. with a special teen/parent meeting. Leaders will welcome our teens and facilitate a brief conversation about youth ministry this year. Teens will leave with their leaders directly following the meeting.

Teachers and leaders will be commissioned for ministry at the 10:15 a.m. service. After the 10:15 a.m. service, we will gather in the courtyard for the **Fall Parish Picnic**. Favorite dishes will be shared, laughter and conversation enjoyed, and even in the midst of all that is hectic and demanding, I know I will find myself revived. I hope you will be too.

VESTRY'S WARDEN

Election of New Vestry Members

On November 10th, the Parish will gather for its Annual Meeting. One of the items of special importance will be the election of new members to the Vestry, replacing those whose terms of service end on December 31st of this year. This *Messenger* article fulfills the obligation stated in our By Laws to announce to the Parish the process that will be followed in this election.

Throughout the summer, the Nominating Committee has been meeting to initiate this election process. We have laid out our schedule for the year and begun conversations with individuals regarding their interest in serving on the Vestry. Any member of St. John's can nominate another member as a candidate for Vestry, and any member that wishes to be considered for Vestry service is encouraged to make this known to a Nominating Committee member (cf. below). Each candidate must submit a signed statement that they are willing to stand for election. All nominations, whether made by the Nominating Committee or by another Parish member, must be given in writing, together with the nominee's statement of their agreement to stand for election, to the Secretary of the Vestry on or before the regular October Vestry meeting (October 21, 2013). The nominating process ends on that date.

Written notice of the slate of candidates will be sent to every member of St. John's Church immediately after the close of the nominating process. The names on the ballot will be reported in the bulletin at all services on the two Sundays immediately preceding the Annual Meeting. It is also the custom at St. John's to post pictures and brief biographic statements of each candidate in the Parish Hall during this time. The election of candidates to the Vestry will be made official by vote of members present at the fall Annual Meeting in November.

We encourage all members of St. John's to keep this process in their thoughts and prayers, and to participate in it according to the above procedure and as prompted by God's Spirit.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As I write this note, we are deep into what I call the “Summer Doldrums”. As you will note in the financial data provided below, our July contributions totaled about 75% off what we had budgeted. While this has been a challenge, with help from the Property Committee and careful monitoring of our cash flow, we have been able to get through this period without requesting additional help from our reserves. Another significant help has been Doug Brown’s repairs of the brickwork on the Church. Doug was kind enough to charge us a much lower rate for the masonry work and frankly did a much better job. Please be sure to thank him.

Heart of the Home

The Diocesan ECW has a mission to assist in the recovery of victims of Hurricane Sandy by supplying items necessary to set up a new kitchen, the heart of the home. Through St. Peter's, Medford, NJ deliveries of needed kitchen supplies, packed in a clear plastic box (kit) will be facilitated. Each parish is asked to contribute one such kit, completed by **September 22**.

I will place the box on the Eagle's Nest table in the parish house, and women are asked to donate one item of their choice to fill it. Suggestions are plastic storage containers with lids, measuring cups and spoons, all varieties of utensils (both plastic and metal), paring knives, dish towels, scrubbies, a can opener, etc. Keep it simple, useful, and know that we have contributed to an ongoing need in our area.

At the Voyagers meeting on Saturday, September 28th, we will welcome St. John's former Rector, The Rev. John Emmert, as our guest speaker and the following is a highlight of his presentation:

“How do clergy stay healthy?”

That is the core question underlying a Wellness Initiative in our diocese, developed by Fathers Ed Messersmith and John Emmert, at the request of Bishop Baxter.

What we know is that people who are called to be intimately involved in caring for others, themselves come in need of care. In Luke the Physician's Gospel, Jesus quotes a proverb: “Physician, heal yourself.” So evidently, he knew something about this, as did the ancient Wisdom.

Starting with those sources and resources, Ed and John have designed a system of mutual pastoral care for clergy. Taking some old, some revised, and some new ideas (or at least new language to express them), we've designed a template whereby clergy can, even better than heal themselves, work on helping one another stay healthy in mind, body and spirit, in order that they may maintain vitality and resilience in the leadership of their congregations.

At the September gathering of the Voyagers, Fr John will be sharing what he and Fr Ed have been doing, and pondering the additional question of how the design might be applied at the congregational level.

Everyone is welcome to learn more at this Voyagers meeting on Saturday, September 28 at 10:00 a.m. in the Parish Hall.

The building and grounds at St. John's are ready for a busy fall schedule of worship, formation and service.

Back to School

Carpets are clean and floors in the Sunday School and All Purpose rooms refinished. Our nursery is even more inviting with new book cases, a kid-sized coat rack and a bulletin board, thanks to Janice Henry, Mike Heider and Pastor Jennifer, respectively. Dehumidifiers, revamped drainage and other proactive measures are being taken to reduce moisture and keep the area safe and free of mold.

On Point

Doug Brown didn't rest after repairing damage to our building resulting from a spring auto accident. He is now **re-pointing** (replacing mortar joints) the **brick masonry** at our narthex entrance. This is part of our annual maintenance effort to protect our historic building. Thank you, Doug, for your always excellent work and dedication to St. John's.

Good Stewards of our Environment

Storm water runoff taxes Lancaster's Sewage Treatment Plant, creating an environmental hazard in the Conestoga River and beyond. Vestry has approved percolation tests of our grounds to determine our ability to create a system (as part of our future renovations) that would allow rain water to infiltrate into the ground rather than into the sewer system as currently occurs. New construction is required to have allowance for storm water runoff and has issued grants to aid those pursuing these efforts. Eventually, Lancaster City will assess fines to properties not in compliance.

Safe and Sound

The final phase of our **fire alarm system installation** is underway. Carbon monoxide and gas detectors will be installed in the Parish House and Auditorium smoke detectors upgraded.

A recent safety alert warned that stainless steel **gas tubing** (which we have in Becker House), can fail during thunderstorms and result in a gas leak and potential fire. A grounding cable will be run to the gas line, eliminating the hazard.

A new **security drop-box** will be installed to enhance protection of receipts before counters arrive on Monday mornings.

The Property Committee is taking a close look at our **liability insurance** coverage to assure our assets are appropriately protected.

Looking to the Future

Vestry approved the Courtyard Committee's resolution to pursue the **all-glass design** of the elevator/lobby entrance. Monthly committee meetings with representatives from Vestry, Finance, Stewardship and Property will continue.

The Property Committee remains supportive of a policy banning tobacco use on the church campus.


DOOR MINISTRY & FOOD BANK - (Contacts: Norma Murphy or Aaron Spicher)

ALERT stands for "All Lancaster Episcopal Response Team". It is a cooperating group of all the Episcopal churches in Lancaster County with a primary focus of identifying and responding to needs within the local area. However, ALERT is not unresponsive to concerns raised outside of Lancaster County. In this capacity, ALERT gathered and delivered 137, five gallon buckets filled with cleaning supplies for Lavallette and Ortley Beach, two barrier island towns decimated by Hurricane Sandy.

It was discovered at that time that the Episcopal Church at Ortley Beach, St. Elisabeth's, was completely destroyed. The sign for the church was found two miles away and some pews were located on the main land. The church has continued to meet in their parish hall which, by God's grace, survived. We have been put in touch with their warden to see if we can assist them to be an ongoing witness in their community. By means of a generous offering raised at a Choir Concert at St. Paul's, Columbia, we have been able to send \$300 to St. Elisabeth's to assist them with their journey.

In addition to aiding the parish, we are trying to help parishioners and others move back into their homes. "Haley and Company" of Lancaster County has once again donated 4 five gallon buckets which we're trying to fill with hand tools to support folks as they return to their dwellings. Through another thoughtful grant, we have received sufficient hammers, tape measures, screwdrivers, and utility knives.

STEWARDSHIP

Sharing Our Stories

Oh, good! You're still reading! Perhaps you're thinking, "Oh, it must be getting close to Stewardship Time," because, for many people,

Stewardship = Pledge

However, your Stewardship Team has been working with a much broader concept, which involves caring for all of the resources with which we've been entrusted (our earth, members of our families and our parish, our tangible resources, our abilities, and our passions). We have been planning activities that highlight different aspects of stewardship: Date Night with Planet Earth; parish pot-luck meals and small-group dinners, to strengthen connections within our parish community; and a talent-and-interest survey, to name a few.

Within our parish, we each have different experiences that have shaped our beliefs and attitudes about caring for and sharing those gifts that have been entrusted to our care. In the coming weeks, some of us will be sharing our stories with you. For some of us, that sharing will be easy, while for others, it will require venturing a bit outside of our comfort zones. Perhaps you have a story of your own to share: long or short, profound, amusing, poignant, or startling. Please consider sharing it with us!

And, yes, beginning later this month, we will focus on our financial pledges to St. John's operating budget for 2014.

But here is our first story, from Julie Gittens:

Like January, September is a month when we plan things. September is when school starts, when autumn begins, when we start thinking about the upcoming holidays and when we have to think about church things. I'll explain about the church things later. The September I started 9th grade, I was in a financial bind. I got weekly allowance money, but it wasn't enough to really do anything with because my parents made me put half of it into my savings account. Thankfully, my older and wiser sister, Lisa, offered me some great advice. She said, "Julie, start babysitting." She explained that our parents would let me spend that money any way I wanted because I had worked for it. So the next day, I sat the kitchen table and made out index cards that said "Neighborhood Babysitter!" with my name, address, phone number and hourly rate. In parenthesis, it said, "Hourly rate goes up one dollar after midnight". I put those cards in every mailbox in my neighborhood. Much to my delight, I got a call back a few days later. A call that changed things in my life.

The call I received was from Allison Crowther; she and her husband Jeff, and their two children, Welles (age 3) and Honor (age 1) had just moved into a house down the street from me. She was looking for a babysitter. She asked me to come over one afternoon so we could meet; she wanted to see how I got along with her kids. For two hours, while she stayed in the kitchen, I played with Welles and Honor. It was a perfect match and I was hired to babysit for them every Saturday night from 7pm to midnight (or longer, if necessary). For two years, I babysat for the Crowthers on Saturday nights, plus holidays and family get-togethers.

Here are few reasons why I got along so well with the Crowthers. First of all, I loved being with Welles and Honor; I don't remember it as babysitting so much as I remember it as getting paid to have fun with them on Saturday nights. Plus, I was paid to work at their family picnics where I felt more like a guest than a babysitter. Mrs. Crowther's first name is Allison, my middle name is Alyson.

STEWARDSHIP (CONTINUED)

The Crowthers are Episcopalians; they attended Grace Episcopal Church (think St. James) and I attended Trinity Episcopal (think St. John's). Mr. Crowther did the NY Times crossword puzzle; my father did the NY Daily News crossword puzzle. And one night, while I was looking through a bookcase, I noticed a book of film reviews. It was written by Mr. Crowther's father, Bosley Crowther, the former film critic for the NY Times. During this time, the local PBS station (WNET) use to show old black and whites movies on Saturday nights. I would read Bosley Crowther's review and then watch the movie. After that, I would watch Siskel and Ebert. By randomly finding that book, I fell in love with movies. It's why I spent all my babysitting money going to the movies. Then one day, Mrs. Crowther told me they were having another baby and moving into a larger house in Nyack. They would have to find a babysitter who lived closer. So we said our goodbyes and kept in touch (on and off) over the years.

Do you remember what you were doing the dreadful Tuesday morning of September 11, 2001? I was working at my new job as a District Manager for Life Uniform and, along with the Regional Manager, visiting stores in Delaware. When I got back into Philly, later that day, the first thing I did was to call my mother and asked about my family. She said everyone was okay and Mark, my brother, a trooper with the NY State Police was still down there working. So like everyone else, I cried while watching over and over again videos of the Twin Towers falling. The reason I mention this is because six months later the NY Times ran an article about the firefighters who died and they mentioned an honorary one: Welles Crowther. My mouth dropped open, Welles Crowther? The Welles Crowther I used to babysit? While reading the article, I learned Welles worked on the 104th floor of the South Tower as an equities trader for Sandler O'Neill and Partners. He also worked as a volunteer firefighter. Thanks to that, he was able to bring a dozen people in the South Tower to safety. After reading the article, I contacted Allison Crowther, surprisingly enough she remembered me. She told me Welles' body had been recovered unburned, with firefighters and emergency care workers at a command post near the South Tower. She told me the time and date of his memorial service. More than 500 people were at his memorial service at Grace Episcopal Church in April 2002.

The reason I bring this up is not simply because it's September, but because I'm a member of our Stewardship Team. To me, Welles's actions are the example of stewardship as described by Paul in 1 Corinthians 10:24: Let no one seek his own good, but the good of his neighbor. Judy Wein, one of the women he saved said, "If he hadn't come back, I wouldn't have made it. People can live 100 years and not have the compassion, the wherewithal to do what he did." I've decided, using Welles as an example that I'm going to show more stewardship towards St. John's Church. This means I'm going to do more volunteer work, even if it means doing something I really don't want to do. More importantly, I'm going to make a monetary pledge to St. John's. Regardless of my finances, I have to remember one thing, if Welles Crowther, someone I used to read stories to at bedtime, was willing to run into a burning building to help people he didn't know, surely I can make a monetary pledge to help St. John's Church, a building and people I do know.
