The Gift

A little boy named Kwasi lived in Lang'ata, a suburb of Nairobi in Kenya. He went to a Christian school, run by the Sisters of the Incarnate Word of God. He lived there and studied hard, excelling in all his subjects. And there he learned the story of Jesus. Kwasi heard stories about how Jesus taught the people and fed the people—as many as 5000 men. And there must have been kids there too—like Kwasi. Kwasi learned that Jesus received everyone who came to him. Jesus showed them compassion and he healed them.

Kwasi loved to hear the stories his teacher would tell about Jesus. He loved to hear how the people brought their children to Jesus, so that he could place his hands on them and bless them. "Let the children come to me," he said, "don't try to stop them, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." That was Kwasi's most favorite part.

Kwasi grew to love the Lord and to love his teacher because she told him these beautiful stories. And to show his love, Kwasi wanted to bring his teacher a special gift. So one day, Kwasi proudly entered the classroom and walked straightway towards his teacher. And holding this most beautiful seashell of lustrous beauty, he reached out, offering it to her.

"Where did you ever find such a beautiful shell?" the teacher asked. Kwasi told her that there was only one spot where such beautiful shells could be found. He named the place; it was a bay many miles away.

The teacher was astonished: "Kwasi...this shell is so beautiful. It is such a wonderful gift... but you shouldn't have gone all that way to get this gift for me."

Kwasi's eyes smiled brightly...and he answered, "The long walk is part of the gift."

Easter reminds us of the long walk God makes with us all. From before the beginning of time, God created us to be with God. God ordered all creation—heaven and earth, the sun and moon and stars. All creatures, God created them; woman and man God created in God's image.

And God makes the long walk with us in Christ Jesus. For when we strayed and when we stray, God never abandons us to the power of death. For God sent God's only and eternal Son, Jesus. God with us as one of us: to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile all humanity to God.

From heaven to the manger, from the manger to the cross, from the cross to the tomb and from the empty tomb to heaven again. Christ Resurrected and Glorified walks with us. The long walk is part of the gift.

This Passion Week, from Palm Sunday to Easter Day, is our time as Church, as a People of Faith to walk with Jesus: from the Upper Room to Cavalry to the tomb on Easter morn. It is St. John's time here in these later 21st century days to experience and proclaim and witness and celebrate the Eternal Walk of the Ages with Jesus.

Search Commíttee Focus Groups

Appreciative Inquiry was the first step in defining what St. John's Episcopal Church is all about. Now that we have begun to create a list of what we value as important ministries in our parish, we want to refine this list a bit more, by delving deeper into discussions about how each of these ministries currently serves our church, and what we would like to see for the future. We also want to consider what role we would like our new rector to play in these various ministries.

On the following page is a chart of the Focus Group Meetings during April. These meetings are designed to answer those questions for each ministry that they represent. The Search Committee asks you to attend at least one meeting in which you have an interest, but you are encouraged to attend as many as you are able.

For each meeting, there is a host or hostess, which we ask that you notify if you are able to attend. You are certainly welcome to attend, even if you did not have a chance to respond, but as you are able, please let them know of your interest.

If you are unable to attend the meeting for a ministry in which you are interested, you may attend the meeting for General Interest. Here we will be considering all sorts of aspects of St. John's, and we are hoping that you can come to share what you think makes our parish so special.

You do not need to be currently involved with the ministry to attend a meeting. For example, the first Focus Group is Music. You do not have to be in the chancel choir or handbell choir to attend. You could simply be someone who sits in the pews on Sunday and enjoys music. We want to hear from everyone about what makes St. John's great and how we can be even better.

The following resolutions were passed by the Vestry on March 19, 2018:

- 1. **Resolution PCC012 Automatic Door Opener.** Resolved, that the Vestry of St. John's approves the expense of \$8,139.00 for Paul Risk Construction Change Order #12. This change order is for adding an automatic ADA door opener for the new Courtyard entrance. This is needed to assist those with physical disabilities when entering the church from the Courtyard. This work was not included with the original bid documents for the project. This additional cost will be covered by the Contingency of the Construction Budget.
- 2. Resolution PCC013 Masonry Repointing. Resolved, that the Vestry of St. John's approves the expense of \$15,335.00 for Paul Risk Construction Change Order #13. This change order is for masonry repairs and re-pointing, and an additional step and wall extension. The repairs and re-pointing are required for the appearance of the new construction. The step and wall extension are required by code. The construction committee had removed the re-pointing allowance from the original bid so that we could limit the re-pointing scope to what was needed for construction and we expected a change order. Regarding the additional step and wall extension, these items were missed on the original bid documents. This additional cost will be covered by the Contingency of the Construction Budget.
- 3. **Resolution PCC016 Courtyard Stairs & Concrete (no railings).** Resolved, that the Vestry of St. John's approves the expense of \$6,588.00 for Paul Risk Construction Change Order #16. This change order is for additional concrete work and stairs in the courtyard area. The work is required since the existing stairs are deteriorating. This work was not included with the original bid documents for the project. This additional cost will be covered by the Contingency of the Construction Budget.
- 4. **Resolution PCC017 Courtyard Storm Water.** Resolved, that the Vestry of St. John's approves the expense of \$6,937.00 for Paul Risk Construction Change Order #17. This change order is for additional rock removal and storm water work. The work is required to have a functional storm water system. The original plan to tie into existing lines was not feasible due to the damage and under sizing of the existing lines. This additional cost will be covered by the Contingency of the Construction Budget. *These resolutions came from the Construction Committee. Bruce Waskowicz asked if all four resolutions could be voted on together. It was agreed that it could be done. Bruce Waskowicz called the question, Glenn Miller seconded. The motion carried.*
- 5. **Interim Rector.** Resolved, St. John's Episcopal Church calls the Rev. Glenn Miller of York, PA, to be the Interim Rector serving while the parish searches for a new permanent rector. Fr. Miller will be compensated \$91,917.00 per year and receive appropriate benefits, i.e., retirement, health insurance, reimbursable expenses and continuing education. Fr. Miller will assume his duties as of April 1, 2018. *This resolution came from the Executive Committee. Sue Heilman moved to approve the resolution, seconded by Peter Novosel. The motion carried.*
- 6. **Paschal Candle and Cassock Albs.** Resolved, the Vestry of St. John's Episcopal Church recognizes the designated gifts in memory of Tim Smyses and Ira Palmer and expresses their appreciation of those gifts. A portion of those funds are hereby designated for the purchase of a new liquid wax Paschal Candle and 2 custom Cassock Albs, the total of which is not to exceed \$700. *This resolution came from the Executive Committee. Sue Heilman called the question, seconded by Webb Cook. The motion carried.*

Due Dílígence

Four candidates, 4 interviews, 12 weeks, and numerous telephones calls, texts and emails – all elements of your Vestry's efforts to find an Interim Rector. The Diocese of Central PA provided us with names of candidates and left the rest to us. They, however, did not expect to have to provide so many names. For various reasons the first three candidates didn't work out of us. The fourth and final one did make the ultimate impression.

By the time you read this article the Vestry will have passed their resolution and the letter of agreement will be signed and we will be well on our way to welcoming our Interim Rector, the Rev. Glenn Miller. His brief biography is below. All of us on the Vestry are very excited about this new pastoral relationship. Although a Lutheran priest, he describes himself as "a closet Episcopalian." And he is no stranger to St. John's, having worshipped with us for a summer a few years ago. He brings a solid pastoral presence, good administrative skills and a wonderful sense of humor. He will be joining us for the first time as Interim Rector on Easter Sunday.

The Vestry is to be commended for their due diligence. This was no easy task and was taken with up great seriousness and dedication to the parish.

Also, to their credit was the success of the Parish Meeting on March 11th. All the appropriate reports were given but more importantly, the task of nominating and electing our Diocesan Convention delegates took place. We congratulate - Debbie Carter, Heather Trenary, Mike Williams, Glenn Miller, Bill Gross, and Marylee Sauder. Two alternate delegates were also elected - Sue Heilman and Charlotte Weaver-Gelzer. We will be well represented in October.

Now, the Vestry's due diligence turns towards Phase II of the Capital Campaign and the completion of our building project as well as the regular business of the parish. Pray for the Vestry as they pray for you!

Our New Interím Rector,

The Rev. Glenn D. Míller

We welcome our new Interim Rector, The Rev. Glenn D. Miller, who will begin serving St. John's on Easter Sunday.

Fr. Miller is ordained into the Lutheran Church (ELCA) with whom the Episcopal Church is in full communion partnership.

Fr. Miller is a native of Harrisburg. He holds a B.A. in Music from the Conservatory at Shenandoah University, and an M.Div. from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg. Fr. Miller began his ordained ministry 32 years ago, serving congregations in York County and Berks County. In 2002, he began a series of institutional calls to ministry, serving as Vice President at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia, Carthage College in Wisconsin and Lutheran Social Services (now SpiriTrust Lutheran) in Pennsylvania. His focus in these positions was in the areas of fundraising and communications.

Fr. Miller is delighted to be back in parish ministry for a time, and especially delighted to be at St. John's. While a Lutheran, Fr. Miller has a longstanding and deep love for the Episcopal church and its liturgical life particularly. In his college years he was a soloist and choirmaster in Episcopal churches. While at Philadelphia Seminary, he worked with the Diocese of Pennsylvania in creating a chair in Anglican Studies. And more recently he served St. John the Baptist Episcopal in York, where he had been a regular worshipper, for three months while they secured an interim rector.

Fr. Miller and his wife Carol reside in York. They have two adult children, a son Jason in Houston, TX, and a daughter Sarah in Sydney, Australia.

Q. What is Confirmation?

A. Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop.

Q. What is required of those to be confirmed?

A. It is required of those to be confirmed that they have been baptized, are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

Please remember that nothing but sand or stone may be placed on any of the new concrete on our campus. Also, please keep in mind that tools, cables and debris should not be touched. We appreciate everyone's understanding and patience as we continue with construction during the increasingly busy use of our facilities. We ask that you exercise caution while moving around our Church campus. Everyone is asked to use designated entrances for each of our buildings, while avoiding construction materials and being aware of uneven walking surfaces.

Despite our construction, we have seen an increase in weekend events this year at St. John's, making it a little challenging for the Property Manager to have everything set-up for all of the individual events during his off hours. Despite the use of our Facility Use Request Form, multiple events during the weekend can make it very difficult to have everything prepared for every group's specific needs. We appreciate everyone's understanding and assistance in this regard. Our Auditorium was used late on Saturday night and needed to be prepared for the parish's Appreciative Inquiry event on Sunday morning. Everyone's understanding and assistance was appreciated during times like this, when not only the preparation, but the return to the normal conditions must be timely for future use.

Joe Way has been very helpful with his preparation of audio-visual equipment. And, the leave taking had many stepping up to the plate for what was a very nice send-off for Fr. John and Cindy Morris. Special thanks go out to Janice and Kevin Henry for their set-up and coordination, as well as Claire Phillips and Leslie Tahsler, who took it upon themselves to have the Auditorium looking amazing! Thanks to all of you for your unbelievable contributions for what was an excellent event! As we have long awaited the latest enhancements to our facilities, the result will be enhanced use of them and an enhanced need for their preparation and return to normalcy.

This month's Life Safety inspection was completed on March 6th. This inspection revealed the need to replace a battery to an emergency lighting unit and repair to another emergency lighting unit. Emergency lighting remains on our list of projects for this year. Testing of the alarm system was not able to be completed due to notification issues with the alarm monitoring company.

It was agreed that we would not be having a Spring Clean-up this year due to all the construction work being performed. However, we are pleased to report that a new light fixture has been added to the passage just outside of our Chapel. We thank Nicole and Thuan Pham for this lovely addition to our Church.
