A NEW YEAR - A FEW NEW THINGS

Greetings brothers and sisters!

The beginning of December, as usual (but not always!) coincides with the beginning of our õNew Yearö in the Church. Advent marks the start of the Christian Liturgical Calendar. Advent and Christmastide will also bring with them a few small changes and opportunities. Let me share them with you.

First, during three of the four weeks of Advent at least, adult learning/formation opportunities will be offered between the morning liturgies. On Advent I, I will lead a discussion on õThe Liturgical Year.ö As we start a õnew year,ö what does this pattern of Christian life and worship mean and where does it come from? Why organize ourselves this way? On Advent II, Don Durand will do a presentation on his participation in a mission trip to Puerto Rico with our brothers and sisters from St. James Parish. On Advent III, join us to meet our new assistant priest, Fr. Stephen Casey. There has been much discussion around the desire to begin offering opportunities for learning and conversation for adults. Please join us for these times!

Second, a small adjustment will begin in JANUARY around õCoffee Hour.ö The fellowship we enjoy during these times ó after 8:00 a.m. liturgy and again after 10:15 a.m. ó are terrific and important. For those preparing and serving the coffee hour however, it makes for a very long morning. In an attempt to lessen this burden slightly, the second coffee hour will be limited to õjust coffeeö most mornings. Those preparing things will leave coffee, tea, hot water, etc., out for the post-10:15 crowd, and our nursery/security person, Maria, will then clean up what remains before she locks up. It is hoped that this small change will make life easier on our coffee hour personnel, while maintaining the fellowship time we have all come to cherish.

Third, I want to remind you all again of the need for a few volunteers (or one particularly energetic volunteer) to take over some scheduling responsibilities around those folks who serve at the liturgy in such roles as lectors, lay eucharistic ministers, etc. This is connected to the elimination of the õhead vergerö role that I spoke about in November. Please speak to me if this is something you might be willing to take on in part or in full. It is vitally important work in our life together.

Finally, as this calendar and liturgical year draw to a close, I want to say what a blessing St. Johnø has been to me. Iøl have been with you 9 months by the close of the month ó starting on Easter Sunday and now, here with you for the Feast of the Nativity. Throughout this õyear of changeö for St. Johnø, it feels to me at least as if we have gotten on pretty well, with ministry flourishing, and the Spirit very clearly being alive and well among us. Thank you for your partnership, support and affection! 2019 will be a year of more change of course as, hopefully, the search committee finishes its work. In the meantime, we press on, knowing that the Spirit continues to guide and bless us in this great and holy place as it has for 165 years!

Peace and all Good. And a blessed Advent and Christmas to you all.

Whereas Deborah Carter has given countless hours in service to St. Johnøs parish through her efforts in the area of electronics and computer work;

And, in her spare time, Deborah has ministered to her brothers and sisters at worship by singing in the chancel choir and as a member of the handbell choir;

This resolution came from the executive committee. The nominees were presented at the October vestry meeting and approved. This resolution serves the purpose of the text for the award. The motion carried.

SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

In November, the Search Committee had the pleasure of meeting several candidates for initial conversations via video conferences. Each candidate offers their unique skills, experiences, and personality to lead St. Johnøs into the future.

After reviewing their resumes and support material, listening to their sermons online, and participating in the interviews, we discussed each candidate and narrowed our list for second interviews. These interviews will take place during early December and January.

When the candidates arrive for a two-day visit, they will visit the church, Lancaster City, and the suburbs. They will meet with the Search Committee, vestry, staff, and a realtor. If you meet with the candidates, we ask that you understand that you are an important part of a candidate¢ decision to join us. We ask that you answer their questions as honestly as possible. We also ask that if you meet a candidate, you keep your conversations private or share only with the search committee or vestry. Understand that you are only seeing part of the whole package that makes a rector. We want your input, but we need to take the whole person into account.

It is still our expectation that we will have one name to submit to the vestry by February. Vestry will then call that individual as our next rector, and we hope they will be able to join us in ministry by Spring or early Summer.

This is probably the most stressful part of the process for the Search Committee so far. We desperately want to bring us the most qualified candidate who we feel will help us continue what we love and still move us into the future. We want to represent all of you to the best of our ability. We want to ensure that we are fair to our candidates. Please continue to hold us, the candidates, and the whole process of discernment in your prayers.

PROPERTY CORNER

We thank Debbie Carter for her donation to support work on our Auditorium HVAC system! Work there will enhance the efficiency of comfort to this level of our Parish House. This work is scheduled to start shortly.

Although not happening in time for the start of Sunday School, our asbestos floor remediation of the Sunday School hallways was completed, with the carpet tiles in the hallways being installed on the following Friday. We thank Janice and Kevin Henry for their role, especially their expertise in this effort!

D. J. Diirner and Sons have been contacted regarding a roof leak on the Chestnut Street side of the Nave. They plan to be out to assess the situation and to make repairs.

We had our second inspection of the Church grounds on Friday, November 9th from the City of Lancaster, which resulted in a full return of our escrow. The inspector was very cooperative, being willing to stop back later that same day to review the front rain garden, in which no remediation had been performed. We took advantage of the inspector expertise regarding the care and maintenance of the grass and gardens. The inspector was very helpful with care and maintenance suggestions. In fact, some reseeding of the grass plots around the parking lot was required.

A review was conducted of our mortar joints, during which it was determined that more work is needed. A+ Masonry was called in to look at these areas, which include the Becker House, with its water penetration in the areas of the Assistant Rectors office and the grandfather clock on the main level. We would like these leaks corrected prior to starting any refinishing. Unfortunately, the exterior paint finish isnot making this goal any easier, as moisture is not allowed to evaporate. The quote also includes re-pointing the entire Parish House wall facing the courtyard, which should start in December.

We are continuing to experience issues with the front entrance at our Atrium. We appreciate everyone patience as we work with Paul Risk to get this situation rectified. The door sub-contractor has been unable to figure out why the electrical breaker for the opener is tripping. This situation causes the opener not to function. We hope to have this situation rectified as quickly as possible.

Your Property Committee is one of the only committees that enhances all the work of our many ministries. It works behind the scenes to ensure St. Johnø functions with its many ministries to make a pleasurable worship and outreach experience for all who use our facilities. We meet on the first Tuesday of every month in the Becker House. We hope you can join us in this vital ministry to our parish. Meetings start at 7 p.m. We hope to see you then.





DISASTER RELIEF - CALIFORNIA FIRES

We have read and viewed on the news in recent weeks about the devastation from fires in California. Communication has been established with St. John's Episcopal Church in Chico CA. The following is an excerpt from their Parish Administrator:

There are several ways to help:

- 1) Donate a monetary amount through the Diocese at <u>www.norcalepiscopal.org</u> or send them a check with "Disaster Relief" written in the memo. Send to The Episcopal Diocese of Northern California, 350 University Avenue, Suite 280, Sacramento, CA 95825.
- 2) Donate gift cards: Visa, Shell gas or other gas cards, department store cards like Target or Walmart, or grocery cards, either Raley's or Safeway. Also Visa cards are very useful.
- 3) Donate monetary amount and send directly to St. John's with "Disaster Relief" written in the memo of the check. Gift cards or check can be sent directly to St. John's Episcopal Church, 2341 Floral Ave., Chico, CA 95926.

We are requesting that "care packages" not be sent at this time. Throughout the city of Chico, shelters and donation centers are overflowing, but as the resources diminish, we will need to replace. It would be a far more organized event to be able to purchase "as needed", and get what is actually required. We currently are housing Team Rubicon, a veteran-based non-profit organization. This disaster team is working diligently with all agencies. We have been able to offer them our parish life center, cots and blankets from Red Cross, and a few home cooked meals. Their workforce numbers are about to increase and the needs are continuing to grow. We are also assisting St. Nicholas's parish, which, though the church did not burn down in Paradise, this congregation will not be able to go back to for many months. They will be opening an office on campus and are now under our care. We are also supporting East Avenue Church with gift cards and work support as their campus is a full-fledged shelter.

Thank you again for your generosity and compassion. Rest assured that any gifts will be used to directly assist those who are suffering from, and assisting in the care of the Camp Fire devastation.


