

SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Search Committee continued to receive applications until December 1st and has spent time reviewing applications, conducting several online video-conferences, and even an in-person interview.

This discernment process continues to be joyous in the number of people that have applied and the people with whom we have talked. They are an amazing mix of people of various ages, both male and female, ranging from no rector experience to almost forty years as a priest. They each bring different gifts.

As a committee we developed a list of both required and preferred qualities and traits, using information that we gathered during Appreciative Inquiry, Focus Groups, and the Parish Survey. We have measured each applicant against those standards, looking for the ones who on paper seem to meet those qualifications. Only then do we hold the video-conference interviews. These interviews are approximately ninety minutes long, and during that time we have found that we get a pretty good feel for that candidate¢s strengths and weaknesses, as well as a sense of who they are as a person.

Believe that the Holy Spirit is leading us through this challenge of discernment, and sit comfortably in the middle of uncertainty. Please continue to pray for the committee and the candidates to be open to the Spirit and the path that God may provide for us. We continue to pray that God will guide us in our decisions.

The *VOYAGERS* are privileged to announce a very special program to welcome in **2019**! Fellow parishioner, **Ken Smith**, has graciously offered to speak to us on the subject of: *"Hi There, Welcome Aboard"* to share with us his story of a 20-year career as a Naval Aviator, flying jets from 13 different US Navy aircraft carriers. Can you imagine landing at sea 785 times? It doesnot stop there -- he also logged more than 14,000 hours of flight time with American Airlines, and, after a brief hiatus when he õretiredö in 2005, he flew for a charter airline, this time to fly troops home from Iraq.

Ken was the <u>first</u> Captain of a US commercial aircraft to fly directly into Iraq to pick up troops, shortening their travel time by about three days. After he logged over 5,000 hours of flight time on this mission, Ken decided it was time to hang up his Captainøs wings for the third and final time. Ken now volunteers at Hospice and Community Care in the Veteran-to-Veteran program for those nearing the end of life.

New Beginnings #2 A retreat for youth in grades 6-8

What is New Beginnings? "New Beginnings" is a unique ministry in the Diocese of Central PA that shares the love of Christ with the middle school-aged youth of today. Throughout the retreat weekend, the high school youth will minister to the middle school youth. "New Beginnings" speaks, listens, and challenges middle school youth to be positive about themselves, their friends, families and their communities, in a critical time in their lives. This ministry reminds them that we are all children of God, we are special, we are loved, and there is nothing that we cannot overcome with Christ.

Who can go to New Beginnings? Anyone in grades 6-8 may attend. You can attend the weekend as many times as you want during these years.

When is New Beginnings? The "New Beginnings" check-in begins at 6 pm on Friday April 5th and continues through a special Eucharist at 11 am on Sunday the 7th. (The entire weekend concludes around 12 noon). Activities include a series of songs, skits, movie clips, and small group discussions. Topics such as God's love, prayer, self, friends, parents, siblings and school are explored, with talks introduced by the high school youth and adult members of the team.

New Beginnings #2 is Friday, April 5, 2019 - Sunday, April 7, 2019.

Where is New Beginnings? Camp Mount Luther, just outside of Mifflinburg, PA


How much does New Beginnings cost? Only \$100.00 per participant! That includes housing in cabins with other youth, all meals, a t-shirt and an entire weekend of activities!

Dear Rev. Frank Russ, Rev. Jean Miller, Members of St. James the Fisherman, and Godøs Beloved in Brunswick County, NC:

Enclosed you will find numerous checks totaling \$3,904.24 for Brunswick Family Assistance and \$300 for St. Jamesødiscretionary fund. This is the result of the ten Episcopal Churches in Lancaster County holding fund raisers to help the people of North Carolina recover from Hurricane Florence. Hereøs a sample of what we did:

One church held a Polka Mass and then had a beer and brats reception afterward. That was a fun afternoon. Two churches held a combination Evensong Service and organ recital and are donating the free-will offerings they received. Another church held a õConcert of Compassionö which featured two singers singing show tunes. They were accompanied by the organist of yet another of our churches. Afterward, we all enjoyed desserts made by the church members.
