Dear Friends,

There is never a bad time really in our lives to give thanks to God. Indeed St. Paul instructs us to õgive thanks at all times.ö But some times, in particularly good times, the need to give God thanks wells up in us.

As I look back over 2018, and now ahead to the new year that we are well into, the things to give thanks to God for well up in my heart. In 2018, we concluded what I believe was a great year of ministry at St. Johnøs, even with multiple transitions in priestly leadership. We dedicated a wonderfully renovated facility, and by the yearøs end, successfully concluded a \$1 million capital campaign.

As you all know by now, it appears that St. Johnøs has identified the next permanent rector to lead our life in Christ into the next chapter. This is cause alone for much rejoicing! And in January, we publicly launched the second capital campaign to complete the fundraising for the renovation, announcing at that event that we are already nearly \$400,000 towards the goal of \$600,000, which will retire the debt on the building completely. What a wonderful thing to be near to accomplishing! What a great gift to the incoming rector and the parish, who will be able to start the next chapter of the St. Johnøs story with no burden of debt. All of these õbigö blessings stand alongside the regular, õnormalö blessings of life in Christ - the daily and weekly blessings of word and sacrament, of fellowship and service.

It was close to a year ago that I had my first conversation about the possibility of coming to St. Johnøs as your interim rector. I could not have fully imagined then what a wonderful blessing lay ahead for me - to be part of this marvelous congregationøs life and ministry. It has been a good year that now lies behind us, and 2019 has begun with great promise for continuing and increasing that goodness.

So, let us give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is indeed good! Blessings upon you all in these cold winter days.

At our celebration luncheon on January 13th, phase II campaign leaders were thrilled to announce that the quiet phase of the campaign to repay the debt of our wonderful renovations has been very successful, with \$370,000 currently pledged toward the \$600,000 goal. Look forward to a spiritual journey and the opportunity to participate in the success of this ministry in the coming months.

VOYAGERS



Men's Group



SOUPER BOWL OF CARING: FEB. 3 LUNCHEON



Most of us are at least somewhat aware that a football game is being played on February 3. Years ago, the Souper Bowl of Caring started at a church in South Carolina with a simple prayer: õLord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat.ö This prayer has inspired a youth-led movement to help hungry and hurting people around the world. Our youth have adopted this program to support our

St. John's Food Pantry Ministry, which serves the needs of our Lancaster neighbors.

On "Souper Bowl" Sunday, our youth will host a soup luncheon at noon, to raise funds for our Food Pantry. They will provide a meal of soup and salad, for which you may make a donation. Soup will also be available to purchase for take out. We will also have envelopes in the pew.

Please give generously! All contributions stay at St. Johnøs, to support our Food Pantry Ministry.

Here's a bit of a glimpse into this very personal ministry to our neighbors:

We distributed about 440 boxes of food in 2018, an average of over 8 boxes each week. Weøve had a steady increase in demand since 2015, when we gave out just under 300 boxes.

Who we serve: We give food to individuals and families; about half of them are in households of 3 or more people. We limit people to one box per month, but very few of them actually come every month, and some come only sporadically, in especially hard times.

We don't require "qualification." Jesus said, õI was hungry and you gave me food.ö He didnøt say, õI was hungry, and I was working 2 jobs, and I earned a college degree, and you gave me food.ö We know that people sometimes have emergencies, and they would otherwise be forced to choose between feeding their children and repairing their car (to get to work) or getting needed medical treatment.

We spent just over \$1,500 last year to fill the gap between food donations and the needs of our neighbors. We welcome monetary donations, in addition to donations of food. When you donate money to the food pantry, we able to stretch those dollars by taking advantage of some very low prices on store brands, due to current competition between grocery stores, and we also visit some out-of-the-way stores whose supplies vary but who usually offer some outstanding low prices.

Thank you for the many ways that you contribute to this ministry, which is very much appreciated by our neighbors!

Volunteers: Distribution of food from our Food Pantry is handled by a group of important volunteers, coordinated by Lynn Hayford. If you would like to help with this effort by giving out food on Tuesday or Thursday afternoons, please contact any of us. Thank you!

As a Happener, whether you are a high school student or an adult (yes, adults may Happen, too!), you will have the opportunity to talk about God, as God is reflected in your daily life, with your peers, the people who will be experiencing the same event with you. Happening is truly an event designed with you and your faith in mind!

Finally, a key piece to a happy Happening is dedication to a friendly, accepting, and understanding environment. No matter who you are, where you come from, or what your favorite cereal happens to be, you are welcomed with open arms.

This year we are fortunate to have one of our St. Johnøs youth, Tierza Mendez, as Rector for this event. Tierza is in charge of running this event and showing her leadership skills. We are so proud of her.


