#### Beloved people of God,

'Grace and peace to you from God our Father, and from the Risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.\_ I place that phrase in quotes because while it s become a common greeting over the centuries; it comes of course from the Apostle Paul. He would often greet congregations with whom he was in relationship with these or similar words. And then, in so many of his letters, that greeting would be followed with advice, counsel, sometimes chastisement, but always concern born out of love for them.

So, for this final Messenger article, I greet you as he greeted the Corinthians, the Romans, the Philippians and others whom he loved. And in like fashion, I would like to follow that greeting with some thoughts as I move toward taking leave of you at the end of June.

First, while my real `goodbye\_ will come on June 30<sup>th</sup>, I want to take the opportunity to say here, to all of you, how enormously grateful I am to you and to God for the year we have had together. Eight years ago, when I returned to Central Pennsylvania, I lived for just a few months down the street from St. John s while our house in York was being readied. On several Sundays in the summer of 2011, I wandered into this delightful church on Chestnut Street. Little did I know or imagine how closely my life would intersect with this congregation back then. But then, that is what our God is rather famous for: To paraphrase C. S. Lewis, `surprising us by joy\_. And what a pure joy you all have been for me. As I leave for the next chapter of my life, I want you to know, from my heart, that while my time with you has been `short\_ in the grand scheme of things, the impact of you on my life will be felt and cherished throughout all my days.

Second, I want to remind you, as you begin a new chapter in your life in Christ, of just what a remarkable, faithful, visionary, committed group of believers you all are, and what God in Christ has in mind for you in this next phase of your life! This is not, I assure you, idle flattery. While there is no perfect congregation (at least none that have humans in them!), St. John's is a truly special place and people. And between who *you* are, and who your marvelous new rector is, I know that there are great things in store for this place. As I mentioned in a sermon recently, it is not so everywhere, sadly. The church and the world are changing, and many congregations are in decline. But it is not so among you! This healthy, vibrant congregation is poised for even greater things in my view. The Spirit of the Lord is clearly alive and well in this place. And so, I entreat you: be open to where the wind of the Spirit is blowing in the coming chapter. Be open as I have experienced you to be in my time here to where and what God is calling you to do and be in the years ahead.

It has been, without exaggeration, the privilege of a lifetime to have spent this year with you. As I look back on it, there are things I m pleased that we were able to accomplish. And there are other things that I wish we could have gotten to. I suppose it is ever thus in life. What matters most of course is that we have walked together, in the words of Bishop Curry, in the Way of Love.

I will close with words of Paul again: `I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy for all of you.\_ And I always will. God bless you all. Fr. Glenn +

## Changes

The month of June ends another era at St. John's. We have all experienced many changes over the last 14 months beginning with the arrival of the Rev. Glenn Miller as our interim rector. Beginning on Easter Sunday in April of 2018, our parish embarked on the uncertain journey into the future.

We had begun our search for a new permanent rector with the establishment of our search committee and the compilation of our parish profile. We did all of this not knowing when the process might end; it could have taken more than a year.

Bishop Audrey Scanlan came to St. John's in May to dedicate our renovations <sup>-</sup> the courtyard, columbarium, accessible front entrance and atrium. The celebration brought closure to many months of planning, fundraising and construction. St. John's deserved that celebration!

The Journey to Adulthood (J2A) group completed another successful pilgrimage, traveling to Costa Rica. Shortly after their return, we bid farewell to the Rev. Barbara Seras, our assistant priest, as she began a well-deserved retirement.

In December, the Rev. Canon Stephen Casey joined the parish having retired as rector of St. Edward's Episcopal Church and began his service as our new part-time assistant priest. His unpredictable sense of humor alone was a bright beacon in the life of the parish. But it was his dedicated ministry to the sick and the homebound, his excellent preaching, and liturgical leadership that will be most remembered.

The new year of 2019 brought a surprising end to our search for a new permanent rector. The search committee recommended the Rev. Amanda Knouse to the Vestry. Having met Amanda in January, the Vestry immediately saw what the search committee saw a very capable and spiritual priest who was more than qualified to lead us into our future. What was even more unexpected was her connection with St. John's through her relationship with the Rev. Peter Greenfield, former rector of St. John's. As of July 1, Amanda will become our nineteenth rector, the first female to do so not only in the parish but the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania as well.

Fr. Miller, in the early months of this year, along with Rosemary Coverly and the Capital Campaign committee, began the quiet phase of the campaign. They visited many parishioners and were able to obtain pledges amounting to over \$400,000. They are hoping to secure pledges for the remaining \$200,000 from the remainder of the parish. Fr. Miller and committee have set the goal of completing the second phase of the Capital Campaign by the end of June.

Now for the sad news! We must say farewell to both Fr. Miller and Fr. Casey. Fr. Casey will be leaving us as of June 23<sup>rd</sup>. He will be leaving to allow our new rector time to establish herself and get to know the parish. His future will involve other parish duties as well as some time to travel and rest. We are grateful to Fr. Casey for his service and the joy he has brought into our lives.



#### **PROPERTY CORNER**

Thanks to Janice and Kevin Henry for their continued work around campus with our flowers and greens this Spring! Our Sanctuary and Chapel look wonderful for this special time in our Christian lives.

We appreciate the work of Carolyn Maxey and her friend Kate who have again agreed to plant flowers in the outside pots. These arrangements are a welcomed sight for a soggy Spring and will continue throughout the Summer.

Ron Bomberger was contacted regarding the refinishing of our Main Level floors in the Parish House. The first time they had available was around Labor Day. We appreciate the funding of this project from the donor who offered to pay for these long-awaited improvements to this space.

And, speaking of refinishing, Kathy Kyper is in the middle of refinishing the corner room on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Becker House. You need to take a look! Thanks Kathy!

As a result of our e-mail poll, it was decided not to pursue a 5-year \$180/month elevator maintenance agreement with ThyssenKrupp. When sharing our concerns over this agreement, a gold plan was offered for a one-year term at \$150/month. Although covering most of the maintenance costs, it would still only apply a 50% discount on weekends, which is when most of any issues would be realized. This plan appears to be a more appropriate plan for our needs, while not locking into a lengthy term that would be difficult to manage. We have passed this offer onto our Vestry, especially since we are still noticing shutdowns, like the one on Easter morning. An issue has been identified which could be easily handle in a more fiscally responsible manner under this agreement.

We have an elevator inspection slated for later this month with Tom Scott. We just learned of the 6-month inspection frequency from a state inspector, who stopped out last week. In addition to this inspection, a more thorough inspection is due every 3 years in order to meet the Labor and Industry Code.

Our proposal to increase our Building Use fee structure, which hadn't been done since our rates were instituted several years ago was approve at the May Vestry meeting. With the increase in venue fees and our costs since its inception, it is believed to be prudent to adjust our fees accordingly.

Our recent life safety inspection resulted in no repairs being needed for this month. Upgrades still remain.

Due to the neighborhood parking taking up our limited space on Sundays, our signs have been reinstalled for `our members and our guests.\_ This action shall discourage use of our lot outside of our permitted hours.


