Just a week ago, your vestry met for their annual retreat. They broke bread with one another and built community. They studied and embraced the sacred business of finances and investment accounts. They raised up and elected our wardens, treasurer, and secretary. Most importantly, your vestry began the holy work of casting a vision for the coming year(s). It was an inspired and life-giving weekend of good work centered on Christ and our shared mission to serve.

Debbie Carter was elected Senior Warden with Webb Cook as Junior Warden. Charles Wear has officially begun his term as Treasurer while Bob Kilp remains our beloved Secretary. All of your vestry representatives are devoted to working together to live into the new opportunities for ministry that are before us.

They have committed themselves to the following 1-year goals:

- ◆ Create new small groups—by providing opportunities for parishioners to form deeper relationships
- ◆ Balance the budget without using additional withdrawals of our investments
- ◆ Raise up, integrate, and support the new staffing structure of the parish to include a quarter-time priest.
- Establish a relationship in a new local community

In addition to 1-year goals, the vestry cast their nets a little further to include the following 3-year goals:

- ♦ *Increase our facility usage by 50%*
- ◆ Complete Phase II of the Capital Campaign
- ◆ Move our rental properties toward marketable rates or use them for ministry
- Expand our Music Ministry at St. John's

In the coming year, our vestry will be focusing on small groups, the ministry of presence (outreach to the vulnerable), newcomers, and pastoral care. # WHY EVENSONG? by Paul Reese

Sunday morning Eucharist is about doing. Together we pray, sing, and celebrate Christ in the Eucharist, and are regularly challenged by Amanda+ to go out into the world and do something. This is the call of Christ, to be light, salt, the city on a hill, to spread the good news of the Gospel over the entire globe. That takes some doing.

Evensong, in contrast, is the taking in of Christ though the cessation of action. Martha was admonished by Jesus for her incessant doing while Mary was praised for listening. Jesus was saying, "Yes, serve, but take moments of time to sit at my feet, gaze in wonder, and listen." Evensong is an Anglican conspiracy against the world's desperate attempt to inundate us with a continual barrage of noise and stuff to do. Evensong is an hour of reflection, beauty, and worship in quiet wonder.



Perhaps this coming Evensong on February 23, 4PM, is custom tailored just to that purpose. We will be considering Christ as he is Transfigured before his closest disciples. While still in the flesh, they were given the miraculous gift of seeing a glimpse of the glorified Christ. I invite you to Evensong, where you, too, can rest and see with the eyes of your heart the beauty of who Christ is.



Pledge payments in December allowed us to reduce the balance on our construction loan by \$50,000. This, of course, reduced the amount we owe, but perhaps just as importantly, will lower the interest payments that are incurred each month. The balance on our one-million-dollar loan is currently \$256,400. We have made great progress.

The St. John's congregation – YOU – have been very generous! However, the current pledge balance will fall short of retiring this debt when it becomes due next year. # **ADULT FORUM: The Refugee Resource Group**


