Honoring Our Past...Securing Our Future: Capital Campaign II

My people will abide in a peaceful habitation, in secure dwellings, and in quiet resting places. Isaiah 32:18

Thanksgiving, a time to be grateful. Amidst the social distancing, mask-wearing, loneliness, and for some, loss of loved ones, 2020 is challenging us to dwell on all that we have to be thankful for. However, as Christians, our faith in a loving God allows us to see through the darkness and appreciate the light that shines for all of us.

St. John's is one of these lights. Through this pandemic our church has been a sanctuary, not only for us as parishioners but for our community. Our spiritual lives have been uplifted in unique ways by a caring clergy. We have supported our neighbors with food, clothing, household supplies, education and a peaceful place to escape. Our renovated spaces have made these things possible. Our clear glass atrium is welcoming and brings the church alive to those passing by. Just ask our clergy and staff how often they wave to or chat with passersby or catch a glimpse of friends using the beautifully restored courtyard with its meditative labyrinth that invites anyone who desires to take time to reflect. Accessibility provided by the elevator and Chestnut Street ramp, although less used in recent months, continues to be a sign that all are welcome. And finally, the columbarium where Amanda has helped families find peaceful closure in this outdoor setting over these difficult months.

We highlight these now-essential church spaces for a few important reasons:

- We made a bold decision several years ago to welcome the future by enhancing our campus to better serve God.
- We made the right decision. Although these spaces still feel new, we don't know how we managed without them.
- We have a responsibility to pay the debt that helped make them possible.

The balance of our loan, \$208,000, is due next October. We are currently paying \$1,000 per month in interest. Outstanding pledges will cover \$113,000, leaving approximately \$100,000 to make us debt free. We can all be grateful to a generous parish community that provided the initial \$1.7 million for this amazing initiative. Closing the remaining \$100,000 gap over the coming months would be a beautiful blessing that would allow all of us to concentrate our time, talent and treasure on the rewarding work God has planned for us. Can you help?

A MEMO FROM THE TREASURER, CHARLES WEAR

Pledge and offering income for October and YTD is now running below budget, but more than offset favorably by other income, primarily unbudgeted designated gifts. Expenses remain below budget despite some significant roofing repair bills. Our actual net operating deficit of \$27,963 through October is close to the budgeted run rate. Our draw from investments remains at \$20,000 for the year, about half of the budgeted amount.
