Galatians 6:9 reads, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." I have found myself repeating this scripture more and more these days. As we continue to navigate the world in which we live, I like some of you, am growing weary. Many folks have hit what the professionals like to call, "the COVID-19 wall." Yet, Galatians reminds us of the call to persevere and the promise that awaits if we do. - Support Groups will continue to use our space for meetings (limited numbers).
- The Village and the Food Pantry will continue to operate as is.
- The staff will continue to work from the office and their homes and will be available via phone/email. In-person visits to the office will be limited to emergency situations only.

Now for the Good News: the clergy and staff have been preparing for this shutdown for months. The life-giving seasons of Advent and Christmas are right around the corner and we believe there are countless opportunities to encounter Christ through our worship and common life together in the coming months. From a Community Christmas Tree to a Christmas pageant never done before the Holy Spirit is moving among us. We are being shaped again by our faith and our perseverance.
