ADVENT WREATH LIGHTING LITURGY: LOVE

- Reader 1 Friends, we come to this circular wreath as a symbolic reminder that God's love has no beginning or end. When we talk about Christmas, we talk about a love song of God kneeling down like a mother to her child saying, "Oh how I love you," to each and every one of us.
- Reader 2 Thus, I invite you to take a deep breath in and let it out slowly. For in that breath, the Holy Spirit speaks love. Now, I invite you to place your hand on the inside of your wrist or on your neck just under your chin. Feel your pulse, notice your heart beating inside you. For in that beat, the love of the Creator sings.
- Reader 1 Today we light the candles of hope, peace, and joy as touchstones of the Christian faith. From those lights, we also light the candle of love, which in one word tells the Christian story. Friends, you are loved. God is love. And Christmas is God's love song for us all.

FIRST LESSON: 2 SAMUEL 7:1-11,16

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING: EUCHARISTIC PRAYER B BCP 340

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And with thy spirit.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them up unto the Lord.

Celebrant Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People It is meet and right so to do.

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God. Because you sent your beloved Son to redeem us from sin and death, and to make us heirs in him of everlasting life; that when he shall come again in power and great triumph to judge the world, we may without shame or fear rejoice to behold his appearing.

Therefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious Name; evermore praising thee, and saying,

Celebrant and People

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts: Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord Most High.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.






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ADVENT & CHRISTMAS AT ST. JOHN'S
