
# THE TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

# THE FIRST LESSON: Deuteronomy 6:1-9 (please be seated)

Moses said: Now this is the commandment--the statutes and the ordinances--that the LORD your God charged me to teach you to observe in the land that you are about to cross into and occupy, so that you and your children and your children's children, may fear the LORD your God all the days of your life, and keep all his decrees and his commandments that I am commanding you, so that your days may be long. Hear therefore, O Israel, and observe them diligently, so that it may go well with you, and so that you may multiply greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, as the LORD, the God of your ancestors, has promised you. Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. THE HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 12:28-34 (please remain standing)

One of the scribes came near and heard the Saducees disputing with one another, and seeing that Jesus answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he is one, and besides him there is no other'; and 'to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength,' and 'to love one's neighbor as oneself,' —this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." SERMON THE REV. AMANDA KNOUSE

# St. John's Traveler Letter: Connecting us to our siblings in Christ across the world

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits! These letters are read in our Sunday School classrooms each week and are a reminder that our church extends far beyond St. John's and Lancaster!

Dear Pastor Amanda,

October 31, 2021

If you and the children at St. John's have the opportunity to travel around the world, one of the first things you may notice is that people speak a lot of different languages. It makes it interesting, and sometimes funny, to figure out how to ask "where's the bus station" or "where's the bathroom" or "what is this that we're eating for dinner"? It also makes it a challenge to share stories with others who don't speak or understand the language I'm speaking. Have you ever tried to tell someone who doesn't speak English how to find St. John's, or when worship services are? Did you use a lot of hand motions? I do. On another note, have you ever picked up a book that is written in a different language? It's hard to understand if you don't know what it says. That may be why *Harry Potter* has been translated into more than 80 languages! Those translations help spread the story.

The story of the church, and of Jesus, was first shared and spread by people in the Holy land who all spoke the same language. As the story was shared in lands farther away, it had to be translated, too. It would be so cool if you could preach and people from all different countries understood you, just as in the second chapter of Acts. If that doesn't happen, though, we rely on translations of the stories we want to share. The Anglican Church in Alexandria (northern Egypt – not northern Virginia) started to grow in the early 1800's because missionaries from England shared copies of the Gospel stories written not in English, but in Arabic. And by learning in Arabic the same stories we learn in English, the people here will know that we are praying for them, from all over the world, in all different languages.


