"Faith of our Fathers" is a Catholic hymn, written in 1849 by Frederick William Faber in memory of the Catholic martyrs from the time of the establishment of the Church of England by Henry VIII and Elizabeth. Faber wrote two versions of the hymn: with seven stanzas for Ireland and with four for England. The Irish version was sung at hurling matches until the 1960s. In England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland it is usually sung to the traditional tune Sawston; in the United States, the tune St Catherine by Henri Hemy is more commonly used.

And finally, I'm thankful for the good people I've met here. While they've been through a lot with the monsoons, they remind me to be grateful for what I have. Some of them have lost everything in the floods, but they still have prepared me food and joined me in singing and dancing in the streets.

While I won't be back for Thanksgiving turkey this year, I hope you think of me and remember why we celebrate this holiday! There is so much to be thankful for on god's green earth! I will keep you all in my prayers.
