

2ND ANNUAL VALENTINE SOCK DRIVE WARM HEARTS FOR WARM FEET





Net expenses for the month were close to budget despite the replacement of the Becker House HVAC system. Our YTD performance is quite positive and should result in a significant operating surplus as was budgeted.

Special Note: The 2021 YTD surplus of \$35.1k includes about \$21k of restricted funds currently categorized as operating income. These funds will be reversed and transferred to the Restricted Investment account before year-end and the operating surplus reduced accordingly.

Love is a Verb

"So, Santa Clause IS real?" "
I don't know... but God is."- Two siblings after receiving their Angel Tree Gifts.

Something extraordinary happened at the Seattle Special Olympics several years ago, I wonder if you have heard of it.

For the hundred-yard dash there were nine contestants, all of them so called physically or mentally disabled. All nine of them assembled at the starting line and at the sound of the gun they took off! But one little boy stumbled and fell and hurt his knee and began to cry. The other eight children heard the boy crying. They slowed down, turned around, saw the boy and ran back to him. Every single one of them ran back to him. One little girl with Down's Syndrome bent down and kissed the boy's knee and said "This will make it better." The little boy got up and he and the rest of the runners linked their arms together and walked to the finish line. They all finished the race at the same time and when they did, everyone in the stadium stood up and clapped and whistled for a long time. And I bet you know why. Because deep down we know what matters in this life is much more than winning for ourselves. What really matters is helping others win too, even if it means slowing down and changing direction.

God reminds us that even the weakest part of us can count toward something good and whole.

Due to the continuing Covid numbers Lancaster County Prison remains on lock down. GED classes can no longer be held in the prison classroom therefore many individuals are needing to learn on their own in their cells. One woman recently shared her joy when she told me how her cellmate was helping her with her math workbook. It was amazing to me to witness the twinkle in her eye while she explained how in -turn she was helping her cellmate with her English.

Even the despair of incarceration is able to be transformed through the loving act of helping others.

Beth Shalom, House of Peace is a transitional living house for recently released mothers who are reunited with their children. The house mother Miss Lenara, (pictured below) shared with me the surprise and gratitude after families received their Angel Tree gifts from St. John's. I learned that the true gift for them was realizing that people thought of them enough to help them celebrate our Savior's birth with toys and basic household items such as sheets and dishes. That was part of their Christmas miracle and, I believe, ours too.

As we continue to grow our relationship with the young mothers and children of Beth Shalom, lets us remain grateful and alert for the many opportunities God gives us to Love.


