

THE SECOND LESSON: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses. THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 2:1-12 (please remain standing)

CelebrantThe Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.PeopleGlory to you, Lord Christ.

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED (*Please stand*)

Holy and wondrous God, long ago you spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways. And in these last days you have spoken to us in your Word made flesh, Jesus, who proclaimed your dream of peace. St. John's Traveler Letter: Connecting us to our siblings in Christ across the world

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits!

Dear Pastor Amanda,

Hello from the United Kingdom! It was here, nearly 500 years ago, that our church began to take shape. Today, more than 100 million people call themselves Anglicans, or Episcopalians as we call ourselves here in the United States.

I'm writing to you from Canterbury Cathedral, which is an absolutely gigantic church in the southeast of England. I just got out of a meeting with Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, who is the leader of the Church of England and spiritual head of the worldwide Anglican Church - in other words, he's a big deal! He's known as the "Primate of All England" and I cannot lie, I laughed to myself because the first thing that came to mind was a monkey! It turns out that the word "primate" comes from a Latin word meaning something like "leader of the church."

Directly above the Archbishop of Canterbury sits Queen Elizabeth, who unfortunately wasn't at our meeting today. She has a busy schedule and, given that she's 95 years old, I don't blame her for skipping out! As one of her many duties, she is known as "Defender of the Faith and Supreme Governor of the Church of England." It's funny to see the government play a role in religion here in the United Kingdom. I'm so used to the separation of church and state in the United States!

I have some downtime before I'm off to Hong Kong, my next destination, and am going to one of the 20 chapels here in the Cathedral to pray. The pandemic has hit England particularly hard and there's a lot of people on my prayer list (hopefully fewer than on yours!). Also, before I go, there's a football match - that's what they call soccer here - between two teams, Chelsea and Brighton, that I'm going to watch on the telly. I'll be cheering for Chelsea because Christian Pulisic, an American soccer player from Hershey, PA, plays for them!
