
THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

Almighty God, you alone can bring into order the unruly wills and affections of sinners: Grant your people grace to love what you command and desire what you promise; that, among the swift and varied changes of the world, our hearts may surely there be fixed where true joys are to be found; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

THE FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 43:16-21 (please be seated)

Thus says the Lord, who makes a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters, who brings out chariot and horse, army and warrior; they lie down, they cannot rise, they are extinguished, quenched like a wick: Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. The wild animals will honor me, the jackals and the ostriches; for I give water in the wilderness, rivers in the desert, to give drink to my chosen people, the people whom I formed for myself so that they might declare my praise.

THE SECOND LESSON: Philippians 3:4b-14

If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 12:1-8 (please stand)

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."

THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED (Please stand)

BCP 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

For all who have commended themselves to our prayers; for our families, friends, and neighbors, especially John Symonds, Angelica, Carl, Chase, Dave Pennell, Emily Lavender, Tiny Nolan, Sandy Grove, Karan, Valerie Lucci, Claire Phillips, Kenneth Robert, Mary Ann, and Tetiana, Alexsandr, Maria, Oleksandr, and their families; that being freed from anxiety, they may live in joy, peace, and health, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, have mercy*.

For all who have died in the communion of your Church, and those whose faith is known to you alone, that, with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, have mercy.*

<u>Diocesan Convention 2022:</u> We are still seeking candidates to be delegates to the Diocesan Convention. So far, six people have agreed to become candidates. We are allowed five delegates and two alternates. We will be accepting nominations until Sunday April 3. At that time, a ballot will be prepared and distributed by Survey Monkey. Paper ballots will be mailed to those who do not have email access. The Vestry has agreed that there will be at least one delegate from each service.

The Convention will be held October 13-15, 2022. On Thursday evening there will be an online business meeting. On Friday and Saturday, the convention will be in person at Spooky Nook in Manheim. Any member of the church 16 years and older is eligible to be a delegate or alternate. If you are interested, please contact a member of the Nominating Committee. Refugee Ministry: St. John's is in the process of forming a Refugee Ministry Team to welcome a refugee family as it transitions to living in our community. We will be working closely with Church World Service (CWS) in areas they've identified: Jobs and Finance, School, Cultural Adjustment, Medical, Transportation, and Housing. Friends in the neighborhood surrounding St. John's plan to work with us.
