Dear St. John's,

Every Wednesday at noon and every Sunday morning, I find my heart filled with love for this community and for God who draws us all together, week after week. I always seem to leave our worship services with a softened heart and gratitude for the relationships that are forming in this sacred space. I pray you are experiencing something similar when you worship. With a new program year beginning, one of our top priorities as a staff is to continue providing meaningful and transformative worship opportunities. To launch us into this new season, we are thrilled to offer a Homecoming Celebration like no other.

On Sunday, September 11 at 9:00AM we will launch into our new program year with a joint worship service and parish breakfast to follow. Not only will we gather as one body in Christ on September 11, but we will also celebrate the Rite 13 class as they continue their journey into adulthood and transition from the Rite 13 class to the J2A class (Journey to Adulthood). The \$26.3k operating deficit for July reflects the lower income anticipated for summer months. Our YTD financials look good, with only a \$1.3k deficit indicating income is basically meeting expenses. Up to this point, utilities are the only expense category of concern due to inflationary rate hikes. All other expense categories are either down or at budget rates. Staffing costs will increase in the upcoming months, but our budgeted investment draw has not yet been tapped and is ready as a reserve to end the year in good shape.

In other news, the renovation of Concord 209 began in July and booked \$1.6k in expenses for the month. The Vestry earmarked \$8.0k as a project budget. Current forecasts now indicate only about half of that will be required, primarily due to the terrific team of volunteers who have done most of the work.



SAFEGAURDING GOD'S CHILDREN

Safety Comes First

We at St. John's have always been concerned with the safety of our kids. Over the last year we have stepped up our training and record keeping as we continue to grow. Our Baptismal Covenant states our commitment "to seek and serve Christ in all persons…and respect the dignity of every human being."

In order to be sure that our kids are best protected we are committed to providing Safeguarding God's Children training three to four times a year. In addition, anyone who has direct or indirect contact with our kids should get the appropriate background checks. These are: 1. PA State Police Criminal History Check 2. PA Child Abuse History Clearance

These background checks are done online. If you are a volunteer, there is no charge for these two clearances. These background checks are valid for five years. If your clearance is more than five years old, then you must update your records.

If you have not lived in Pennsylvania for at least the last ten years, then you must also get an FBI Criminal History Clearance.

How to get involved

We will be offering Safeguarding God's Children training at St. John's on Sunday, October 2nd , at Noon, in the Parish Hall. If you fill any of the following roles at St. John's, you should take the training if you have not done so within the last five years:

Clergy

- Vestry (including church officers)
- Lay Employees, Eagle's Nest Volunteers
- Volunteer Office Staff
- Sunday School Teachers, Youth Leaders, Nursery Volunteers LEMs/LEVs
- Ushers
- Lay Worship Leaders
- Food Pantry Volunteers
- Anyone who has or wishes to have a key to the building

As our Rector says, "our children are not the future of the church, they are the present". These presents are a gift from God, and it is up 7 to us to keep them safe.

Caring Ministry

As St. John's gears up for a new church year, the Caring Ministry (formerly Pastoral Care) has information it would like to share.

Lay Eucharistic Visitors

Lay Eucharistic Visitors (LEVs) offer meaningful fellowship for our St. John's friends at home, and we're looking to grow this important ministry. LEVs' visits are an extension of that week's church service — with readings, prayers, words from the sermon and the eucharist. It is a special time for all involved.

LEVs often visit in teams of two, and St. John's currently has five LEVs. We are looking to increase that number! LEVs receive special training. A date for the training will be publicized once it is available. If you want to learn more about what being a LEV entails, please talk with Deacon Jen or current LEVs — Sue Heilman, Karen Latshaw, Sue Martin, Kathy Novosel, and Peter Novosel.

Congregational Calls

Later this fall, each parish family will receive a call from a Caring Ministry team member or Vestry member. After the isolation of covid, we'd like to see how you are doing, let you know you are loved, and ask if there's anything you need and how the church could help.



Call the Church Office

If you have a prayer request or another need, please call the church office. Our office is staffed with kind, compassionate, and efficient volunteers. They'll take your request and make sure it's delivered to the right person. ALSO, if you or a family member enters the hospital and you want the church to know, please call the church office. Hospitals don't call the church to tell us, so we want to be sure you receive support if you'd like it.



CONFIRMATION RECEPTION REAFFIRMATION

With the Bishop's visit officially on the books (November 20), it is time to begin our preparations for her visit! One of the roles of our bishop is the Confirmation, Reception, and Reaffirmation of members of the parish.

Youth and adults are regularly confirmed, making this choice for themselves to affirm their baptismal vows. For those who may have been confirmed in another denomination (Roman Catholic, Orthodox, Presbyterian, Methodist, Lutheran, etc.) the Prayer Book provides for Reception, whereby one is formally received into The Episcopal Church, honoring the commitment one made in their previous denomination.

The rite of Reaffirmation is celebrated with a confirmed Episcopalian who, for personal reasons, wishes to publicly reaffirm their baptismal vows to the bishop and the community. In both reception and reaffirmation, we pray that the Holy Spirit continues to transform and deepen the candidates' faith.

This fall we will hold two classes, one for adults and another for youth. We will explore what we believe as Episcopalians, the role of the sacraments, the importance of scripture, our history, and more. 

Vestry Highlights From our August 21, 2022 Meeting

Monthly Financial Report: Treasurer's Report: As of July 31, we had a small deficit of \$1,300 which is essentially a balanced report. Pledge income is still running about \$20,000 ahead of 2021. Overall expenses are okay, but we can expect an increase in the future. Looking forward:

- Our surplus in the checking account is dropping.
- We now have an Ordained Assistant Rector (effective in August)
- We have not taken any of our investment draw yet Our bookkeeper charges are higher than expected in the transition.
- Utilities, especially power and gas, are a real concern.



The Sunday School Teachers and Youth Leaders are preparing for a new program year. We have a number of new students enrolled this year. An open house to see the classrooms will take place on Homecoming Sunday, September 11. Classes will begin on September 18. Adult formation will begin on Sunday, September 4 led by Deacon Stacey+ and Barbara Landis.




We had an outstanding Neighborhood BBQ on Saturday August 19. Leslie Morgan was commended for her leadership of this event. The members of the Property Committee are to be thanked for all the work they have put into updating and improving the property. It was reported that volunteers spent 820 person hours in this work over a two-month period.



Karen DiPace will lead the Coffee Hour organization. There are four Sundays at which we will have a single service. They are Homecoming, All Saints, Easter, and Pentecost. On these Sundays we will have a Parish Breakfast. The Vestry has been volunteered to host the breakfast on Homecoming Sunday, September 11, 2022.

CARING MINISTRY

The Caring Ministry is working on formalizing procedures regarding the prayer list. Members of the committee and the vestry will be making calls to parishioners to check in and connect. Members brainstormed about improving communications with church members.



STEWARDSHIP

The HVAC system is an ongoing priority. Estimates are being received for its replacement. The step from the Parish Hall Stairway to the Atrium has been the location of several falls recently. The architect is meeting with members of Property Committee later this month. Our phone system is now operational and the fire hazard in the Becker House basement has been resolved.

The Yard Give was a huge success. More donations than ever; fewer items left over for the committee to dispose of; and we made \$1300 for the Operating Budget. The 2023 Stewardship plans are being implemented. There will be three weeks of Stewardship education in October followed by Commitment Sunday on All Saints Sunday.

NEW BUSINESS:

- The Housing Resolution for The Rev. Jen Trenary was approved unanimously.

- The Vestry meeting ended with a discussion regarding the financial future of the parish. The rector was excused and compensation, property needs, and the budget outlook was discussed. An increase in pledging units will be critical to the health of our parish in 2023. Additional information can be found in the full minutes located on the Parish Hall Bulletin Board.
