

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Connecting to our siblings in Christ across the world
Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places
we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the
church and the places he visits:

Dear Amanda,

I send you greetings this week from north of the equator again, although just barely. I arrived in Bangladesh during a time of political and international stress. Bangladesh lies between India to its west and China to its east. While those two superpower countries are at odds, the prime minister here, Sheikh Hasina, has stated her position as "friendship to all, malice to none." This country has struggled with strife since its beginnings. These people and their rich culture go back to before Christian times, but politically Bangladesh has only been an independent country since 1971. Before that it was part of India, and then part of Pakistan, and sometimes known as part of Bengal. But politics and war often put the common people at risk, and Bangladesh was in serious trouble as it gained its independence. Your parents and grandparents may remember George Harrison's Concert For Bangladesh, which was the world's first rock concert organized to raise awareness and funds for people in trouble. In fact this became the model for the better known Live Aid concert in 1985. Several lines from Harrison's song "Bangla Desh" explain how it came together:

"My friend came to see me, with sadness in his eyes, He told me that he wanted help, before his country dies, Although I couldn't feel the pain, I knew I had to try, Now I'm asking all of you to help us save some lives."

And now, all these years later, the church and other good people are still working hard to save some lives. While you may not feel their pain, please include these people in your prayers on Sunday, and follow the words of Prime Minister Hasina, "friendship to all, malice to none."
