

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Connecting to our siblings in Christ across the world
Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places
we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the
church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda.

This week I am in the Province de L'Eglise Anglicane Du Congo, or in English: the Anglican Province of Congo. You may know that Congo is in Africa, but do you know that these are really two countries? The Republic of The Congo was once controlled by France, and the Democratic Republic of The Congo was once controlled by Belgium. Both countries are now independent, and both make up the Anglican Province of Congo. French and Flemish are significant languages here, although many of the people attending Anglican churches live in the east near Kenya and speak Swahili. It can be confusing. And even more confusing - the Equator passes through both countries in their northern territories. That means that one day it's Summer in one village north of the Equator and Winter in a neighboring village just south of the Equator, and then the next day it's Fall in the northern village and Spring in the southern village! In reality it doesn't matter all that much as it's mostly hot all year round.

The republics of the Congo are of course home to the famous Congo River. In places it is the deepest river in the world, and it carries more water than just about any other, maybe except for the Amazon River in South America. Additionally, the republics of the Congo are sometimes thought to be the richest countries in the world due to the vast amounts of minerals and metals that are found in the soil. That may be one of the reasons France and Belgium had such an interest here years ago. But now the Congolese people are able to control their own resources and govern their countries.

The Anglican Province has a new Arch Bishop, Georges Titre Ande, who is leading the church's plans to grow and establish an Anglican Center in the capital, Kinshasa. If you can find it on your map, and you'll see that Kinshasa is a long way from the eastern lake regions where most Anglicans live today. Join me in praying for their good works, and that they have success in building a bigger faith community in this wonderful country.


