

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Connecting to our siblings in Christ across the world

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places
we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the
church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

I write to you with greetings from Valparaiso, along the sunny coastline of Chile. That doesn't narrow it down very much, as Chile has the longest coastline of any country in the world. This is a long and skinny country in South America, enjoying many miles of views overlooking the Pacific Ocean. Valparaiso is a city built on the hills facing the ocean. The well-known poet Pablo Neruda had a home here, and once wrote that "if we walk up and down all the stairs in Valparaiso we'll have walked all round the world." A beautiful city in a beautiful location, he told friends that Valpo (as the locals call it) rests on the "Queen of all the world's coasts."

I'll be visiting the Anglican Cathedral of St. Paul, which is the oldest Anglican Church in Chile. It was built in 1858, just about the same time as St. John's there in Lancaster. They open their doors every Sunday at noon for a concert of its organ that's more than one hundred years old. St. Paul's installed this Queen Victoria Memorial Organ in 1902. And then four years later a large earthquake damaged the church and the organ in 1906, but it's been repaired over the years. They say it has 33 families of tubes, and 1,604 pipes. I don't really know what that means, but it sounds impressive. Maybe St. John's organist Doug can explain more about that. I'm just looking forward to hearing its music.

I'm also looking forward to being at St. Paul's as we approach All Saints Day. The Halloween traditions in America are only a small part of the season here, but many people remember and honor the saints that have gone before them, surround them now, and are yet to come. I wish you a fun Halloween, and a blessed All Saints Day, as we stay together in prayer and close in spirit.
