Connecting to our siblings in Christ across the world

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Amanda,

'Ello guvnah! Hello from across the pond! I write to you this week from London in England where I just met the new King! I'm sure you remember when the Queen died – God rest her soul – just a couple months ago. This was the first time I met her son, the new King Charles III.

Not only is Charles III the King, he's also the head of the Church of England. As Americans, I know that's something we're not used to – in the US, politics and our religions are kept mostly separate. But it's different here. In England, the King (or Queen) works with the Prime Minister to appoint bishops and other important people in the Church. Imagine if President Biden would be able to say who gets to be a bishop – that would be very different than what we have now.

With the new King, things have changed a lot since I was last in England, but they also have stayed the same in many ways. I've visited some Cathedrals that have been here for centuries and it rains just as much as before. Despite the weather, people are just as kind and friendly to me. I hope you're able to find that warmth from those around you, especially as the weather grows colder!
