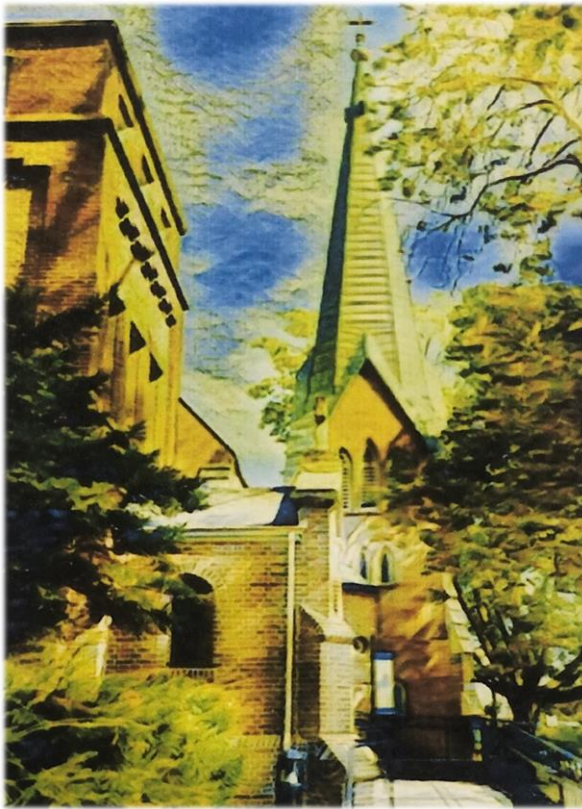

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. The people stood by, watching Jesus on the cross; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation?"

**SERMON**

*Bishop*            Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil?  
*Candidate*        *I do.*

*Bishop*            Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?  
*Candidate*        *I do, and with God's grace I will follow him as my Savior and Lord.*

*After all have been presented, the Bishop addresses the congregation, saying*

*Bishop*            Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?  
*People*            *We will.*

*Bishop*            Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,

of bread, and in the prayers?  
*People* *I will, with God's help.*

*Celebrant* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent  
and return to the Lord?  
*People* *I will, with God's help.*

*Celebrant* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in  
Christ?  
*People* *I will, with God's help.*

*Celebrant* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as  
yourself?  
*People* *I will, with God's help.*

*Celebrant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the  
dignity of every human being?  
*People* *I will, with God's help.*

*The Bishop then says to the congregation*

Let us now pray for these persons who have renewed their commitment to Christ.

*Leader* Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

*People* *Lord, hear our prayer.*

*Leader* Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

*Leader* Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

*People* *Lord, hear our prayer.*

*Leader* Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

*People* *Lord, hear our prayer.*

*Leader* Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

*People* *Lord, hear our prayer.*

*Leader* Send them into the world in witness to your love.

*People* *Lord, hear our prayer.*

*Leader* Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

*People* *Lord, hear our prayer.*

*Bishop* Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in these your servants the covenant you have made with them at their baptism. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

## **St. John's Traveler Letter:**

*Connecting to our siblings in Christ across the world*

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

Hello from the tiny island of Mauritius! I'm south of the equator in the middle of the Indian Ocean, where we're only a month away from summer. Right now, it's almost 80 degrees – don't tell me how chilly it is in Pennsylvania!

This is my second trip this year to Mauritius, which is one of the many islands that make up the Church of the Province of the Indian Ocean. You may remember back in January when I travelled to Madagascar and the Seychelles – two other island nations in this province. I certainly remember how blue the water was, which is all the more remarkable given the horrible oil spill that happened here in July 2020. Over one thousand tons of oil leaked out of a large oil ship into the beautiful ocean and lagoons surrounding it. Since my last visit here earlier this year, however, I'm happy to say that things are cleaned up.

It's a great reminder of all the good work people can do with God's grace when they come together with a shared goal in mind. We are so much stronger standing together than standing alone, and I can't tell you how many conversations I had with locals here who all played their part in helping the coast and animals recover from the spill. I am thankful for their stories and the ability to hear them firsthand.

I hope you find something to be thankful for this week of all weeks. Happy thanksgiving, St. Johns!
