

VESTRY ARTICLE

The Rt. Rev. Audrey Scanlan, Bishop of the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania, attended our November meeting following a pleasant lunch. We asked the bishop about the future of the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania in light of the study group that was recently approved at the convention. The bishop explained that the study group will work to determine potential opportunities with the Diocese of Bethlehem. She then went into the current situation in both dioceses (Bethlehem and Central Pennsylvania). Both dioceses had to close a number of churches over the last decades due to low membership. Central Pennsylvania now has sixty parishes. Of these 20% do not have a permanent clergy person, and another 10% have no clergy at all. The bishop expressed her happiness with being able to visit a strong parish like St. John's-Lancaster.

At the formal meeting, the Vestry was able to confirm the bishop's impression of St. John's being a strong parish by taking two critical actions. First, we reaffirmed our commitment to the 2023 Parish Assessment unanimously. Second, though our 2023 Budget negotiations are still in progress, we approved the Clergy compensation package that included a 5% increase is salary and housing costs. The second actin was taken only after they were assured by the Treasurer and Vestry Steward for Finance that we would continue our work to achieve a balanced budget again in 2023. We are on track to have a balanced Budget for a third consecutive year in 2022.

The Vestry will be preparing to make its work more meaningful by discussing different organizing methods. This will be discussed further at the December meeting and fleshed out in greater detail at the annual Vestry Retreat planned for January 6-7, 2023.

As the end of the year approaches, our operating financials still appear on track to meet a balanced budget. Our income exceeds expenses through October, but deficits in the remaining months and year-end accounting adjustments will offset the surplus. Work continues on developing the 2023 operating budget. As reported in the annual meeting, expenses in the latest draft are \$84k higher than the 2022 budget. This significant increase is due primarily to our transition to full staffing as well as general inflation. We will require increased sources of income to meet this challenge or be faced with increased withdrawals from our investment savings account.


