





Happy New Year! Welcome to 2023, the year of discovering Christ in our midst, the year of finding new rhythms and postures, the year of leaning into the light of Christ himself. As you pray, consider your spirit, body, mind, relationships, home, work, resources, or another category you find helpful.


- Draw near to God. Become present. Rest your mind and heart.

### OUTREACH

# THE MANY MEMBERS OF OUR OUTREACH TEAMS CONTINUE THEIR SPLENDID WORK IN CHRIST'S NAME WHILE MAKING PLANS TO DO MORE IN 2023.

The Food Pantry served 148 in October and 180 in November. They have served 1506 individuals/ family units so far this year. They were able to fill 35 boxes from donations they received. This enabled the committee to save \$340 in expenses. Marion Wear is leading volunteers in planning to increase their fundraising efforts with a target of raising \$20,000 in 2023. We received a \$10,000 memorial and about \$4000 in donations towards this goal. The group is working on Souper Bowl of Caring Event. The committee has developed a brochure highlighting their efforts.

The Community Breakfast crew served over 90 people in October and over 100 in November. We began offering inside service at First Reformed UCC in December. St. John's was the first team to do so. The menu is the same as 2022.



#### Stacey Catigano reports that:

- F3 (Food, Faith, and Fellowship) is growing. The Committee is developing its own internal structure to assure that the finances are appropriately used.
- In December, Stacy+ met with the prison warden and Probationary Officers to help vet people for community service opportunities at St. John's.
- Stacey+ reports that Worship at prison is happening. 9 parishioners wanted to help.
- In planning for Easter, Stacey+ is working on getting Beth Shalom residents to come worship with us.
- We are supporting F2 (Faith & Finance).
   St. Thomas members lead this.
- Members of the F2 and F3 teams were recognized and commissioned during our services on Sunday December 11.

The Refugee team was diligent in reporting our hours of service toward our family. As a result, CWS will pay an additional 2 months of rent. All three children are in school. The committee is working on helping Mr. Abdifind employment closer to the City of Lancaster.

Sue Martin reported that the Election Day Bake sale raised \$890 for Eagles Nest. This was a record year. Deb Smith reported that we raised \$2,244 through the Christmas Bazaar so far. There are some additional funds coming in. The funds were raised for our Eagles Nest after school program. The Angel Tree gift gathering was a tremendous success. We will have a fuller report next month.

But as noted last month, most if not all of the surplus funds are restricted gifts that will be transferred to their respective investment account as part of the year-end closing process. We continue to expect therefore, to close the year at or near a balanced budget.


# VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

At our December meeting, where we finished the work of 2022 and began the work of 2023, Deacon Stacey led us in reflection with Maya Angelou's Christmas poem, "Amazing Peace." On Sunday, January 1, the St. John's Award was presented to Paul and Liz West for their leadership in the restoration of the 209 Concord Street property (the new home for our refugee family), their dedication to the food pantry effort and their participation in the chancel choir. The Vestry is grateful for these and countless other ways in which they give their time and talents to our church community.

A generous memorial gift of \$10,000 and an additional \$4,000 in member donations were received. These gifts, earmarked for the food pantry, will allow St. John's to continue to assist in the community's growing needs. The annual Vestry retreat will take place on January 6 and 7. In addition to welcoming new Vestry members Kathy Kyper, Ted Loose and Liz West; the Vestry hopes to prayerfully discern where the spirit is leading St. John's in the coming year, both in service to the parishioners of St. Johns and to the community.

The 2023 budget was unanimously approved. The clergy, lay leaders and St. John's faithful, have worked diligently to support the various missions of the church, while also controlling expenses. The Vestry is most grateful for the continued strong financial support of the congregation. Martha's Ministry Bazaar and the Election Day Bake Sale efforts received strong support from both our parishioners and our neighbors. With the business of 2022 nearly concluded, the Vestry voted unanimously to support the payment of bonuses to staff members.

John Gouveia, Joe Way, and Paula Wolf were recognized and thanked for their contributions as Vestry members.
