**THE FIRST LESSON:** Genesis 18:1-15 (please be seated)

The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, "My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, "Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes." Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

They said to him, "Where is your wife Sarah?" And he said, "There, in the tent." Then one said, "I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son." And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, "After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I have pleasure?" The Lord said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh, and say, 'Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?' Is anything too wonderful for the Lord? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son." But Sarah denied, saying, "I did not laugh"; for she was afraid. He said, "Oh yes, you did laugh."

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

#### THE NICENE CREED (please rise in body or spirit)

# St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

I wish all the dads and all who are father figures to others at St. John's a Happy Father's Day as you celebrate it there in Lancaster. The folks here in Australia celebrate Father's Day in September, so there will be more cookouts then. Australia is a fascinating and beautiful land, with a complicated history of centuries old aboriginal cultures and more modern European power and control. It has the largest population in Oceana, of about 25 million people. It's surrounded by oceans, which means there are beaches everywhere you look, and in fact it's estimated that 85% of the people here live within 30 miles of a beach. Lots of opportunities to go surfing!

I'm visiting friends inland in Dorrigo, in New South Wales, Australia. This is farm country, and it makes me miss Lancaster County, but it's very hot and dry here. The wildlife is, well, wild. Koalas, dingos, and kangaroos of course. The kangaroos thrive in this environment, although some of the farmers probably wish they wouldn't be quite so prolific.

You may know that England first sent sailors and convicts to colonize this land in 1788. Up until the early 1900's Anglicans in this inland town worshipped in their homes. A dedicated church was built in 1908, and now St. Stephen's Anglican Church holds services in a building that was consecrated in 1970. Being a rural church it's not big enough to have a priest dedicated just to this parish, so on most Sundays you'll see Reverend Mike on his motorcycle going to lead worship at two or three other churches, too. As with many provinces in the Anglican Communion, some churches here are very conservative and don't even allow women to be priests or deacons, and some churches are very progressive and open their doors to everyone whether worshipping, serving, or leading. I appreciate the attempts by all to get along within the Anglican Communion rather than breaking apart. As the saying goes, "At the end of the day I'd rather be excluded for who I include, than included for who I exclude."

Blessings to you from Down Under, and Peace to all who journey, too.
