RECTOR'S MESSAGE

A SIMPLE INVITATION

DEAR ST. JOHN'S,

A few weeks ago, at our Wednesday worship service, we celebrated the Feast of St. Matthew. Like many of the other disciples, Matthew received a call to follow Jesus that interrupted his life in a profound way. While sitting at his table, collecting taxes for the Roman Empire, Jesus sought him out and echoed the words many of us are familiar with, "follow me." Matthew in response, left his profession, his way of life, and said yes to God's invitation. Now, before Matthew left with his newfound community to travel into parts unknown, he did something interesting. He extended an invitation to Jesus to eat at his home,

but it wasn't a private dinner party. Matthew also invited his friends, other tax collectors, and folks from his neighborhood. It was an a rather odd gathering of misfits and outcasts; one that Jesus gladly accepted despite the grumblings and disapproval of the religious leaders of his day.

Matthew's dinner party continues to be on my mind weeks later. I know the power of an invitation and how being welcomed into a person's home can change a relationship. I know how transformative an invitation into community can be for one's faith journey. I am a follower of Jesus because I was invited. In today's world, people are more connected than any previous generation, yet lonelier than ever before. With social media outlets, smart phones, and web browsers in our pockets, it's easy to mistake information for intimacy, communication for community. I want St. John's to take a page out of Matthew's play book and extend an invitation to others who may not have a faith community to call their own.

There is something holy and sacred about the church – it's a place set apart where we can question and discern scripture and hear the Good News proclaimed, a place to live into our baptismal vows by learning how to love as Christ loved, it's a place that challenges, empowers, and encourages those who gather there. It's a place where God meets us in sacrament, song, and service. St. John's is a place I want others to experience because my life has been so drastically changed for the better because of it.

So, friends, I invite you to invite others. Extend a simple invitation because what's happening here needs to be shared, because in a world that is desperate for connection, there's a community waiting with open seats and open hearts.

Confirmation, Reception, Reaffirmation

With a new program year upon us, it's time to prepare for Confirmations, Receptions, and Reaffirmation at St. John's! Adults and youth are confirmed during the Bishop's visit each year by making a choice to publicly affirm their faith and recommit themselves to the responsibilities of their Baptism. For those who may have been confirmed in another denomination (Roman Catholic, Orthodox, Lutheran, Moravian) the Prayer Book provides for Reception, whereby one is formally received into The Episcopal Church, honoring the commitment one made in their previous denomination.

The rite of Reaffirmation is celebrated with a confirmed Episcopalian who, for personal reasons, wishes to publicly reaffirm their baptismal vows to the bishop and the community. In both reception and reaffirmation, we pray that the Holy Spirit continues to transform and deepen the candidates' faith.

This fall we will hold two classes, one for adults and another for youth. We will explore what we believe as Episcopalians, the role of the sacraments, the importance of scripture, our history and doctrine, and more. We had a \$12.6k operating deficit in August but were able to maintain our minimum checking account balance without taking another budgeted draw from the investment accounts. The Yard Give produced \$1,320 of income for general operating purposes. Food pantry operating deficit is \$6,153 YTD, but recent cash donations have been significant and should bring this down for next month. Final charges for brick repointing were split \$5,800 each for church and 209 Concord. Another \$1,403 was expensed to church/office for HVAC repairs. Only one routine transaction was made in our restricted account in August. Otherwise, values for both investment accounts moved down slightly by market only.

Refugee Ministry Update

Last month marked the end of our first year assisting the Abdi family as they transition to their new life here in Lancaster. Church World Service helped Bati, Halima, and sons, Abdalla and Abidisa, and daughter, Sutan through the refugee resettlement process and St. John's provided them with a place to live at churchowned housing (209 Concord St.). In addition, a church team has worked with the family as it navigated the unfamiliar territory of filling out forms, paying bills, understanding the basics of how things in the house work, setting up doctor appointments, visiting with school guidance counselors, attempting to learn English, and, well, the list goes on of taking care of things we see as routine, but can be completely befuddling to those new to our country.

We've sometimes struggled with helping them adjust to cultural differences and we've come to recognize that it's important to respect these differences and the dynamics of their family's interaction. However, while sensitive to whatever they went through that made them want to come to our nation, we have always tried to impress upon them the things necessary to becoming as self-reliant as possible as they transition to a new life. Our team has not always enjoyed the success it hoped for in assisting the family. There are many things we have learned along the way.

However, there have been many hours spent working with the family. Bati once asked, "Why does the church help us so much?" Our response: "It's what our faith calls us to do." As can be seen from Bati and Halima's message below, the family is indeed appreciative:

Our family wants to thank the people of St. John's for all their help this year. We very much appreciate it and have seen in practice very good people who try to help. We didn't know this type of help before we came to the United States. We are very, very thankful. We have learned so many things. We look forward to learning more and we won't forget you.

As we enter the second year of working with the Abdi family, we will be preparing them for their move to a new home at the end of June, 2024. We'll be helping them find a new place and continue to assist them in becoming more selfreliant. That has been St. John's goal all along: help them become as self-reliant as possible. With all that's been learned from our time working with the Abdi family, at the appropriate time, we'll ready 209 Concord to serve another family. in need of help as it begins its transition.



There are so many opportunities for mission here at St. John's, we are truly blessed. Another is the ALERT program. The All Lancaster Episcopal Response Team was formed by Fr. Pete Greenfield in response to hurricane Sandy. It is comprised of the churches of Lancaster who work together to provide assistance in cases of emergency or urgent need. These various projects include providing buckets of cleaning supplies after hurricane Sandy, supporting the mission trips to Puerto Rico, assisting in the AIDS garden, providing supplies to Beth Shalom house, working with the community in Jersey Shore, supporting the development of the retreat center in Potter County, offering financial support to Episcopal churches damaged by hurricanes or fires. What makes this special is the opportunity to work with our friends from other churches. There is a strong spiritual component to the program as well. We all learn from each other. As time goes on, we need to have additional members from St. John's. This would involve once a month meeting (usually Zoom).
