

## THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

O God, whose blessed Son came into the world that he might destroy the works of the devil and make us children of God and heirs of eternal life: Grant that, having this hope, we may purify ourselves as he is pure; that, when he comes again with power and great glory, we may be made like him in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

**THE FIRST LESSON:** Joshua 24:1-3a, 14-25 (please be seated)

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel to Shechem, and summoned the elders, the heads, the judges, and the officers of Israel; and they presented themselves before God. And Joshua said to all the people, "Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel: Long ago your ancestors—Terah and his sons Abraham and Nahor—lived beyond the Euphrates and served other gods. Then I took your father Abraham from beyond the River and led him through all the land of Canaan and made his offspring many. "Now therefore revere the Lord, and serve him in sincerity and in faithfulness; put away the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the Lord. Now if you are unwilling to serve the Lord, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your ancestors served in the region beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living; but as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

Then the people answered, "Far be it from us that we should forsake the Lord to serve other gods; for it is the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors up from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, and who did those great signs in our sight. He protected us along all the way that we went, and among all the peoples through whom we passed; and the Lord drove out before us all the peoples, the Amorites who lived in the land. Therefore we also will serve the Lord, for he is our God." But Joshua said to the people, "You cannot serve the Lord, for he is a holy God. He is a jealous God; he will not forgive your transgressions or your sins. If you forsake the Lord and serve foreign gods, then he will turn and do you harm, and consume you, after having done you good." And the people said to Joshua, "No, we will serve the Lord!" Then Joshua said to the people, "You are witnesses against yourselves that you have chosen the Lord, to serve him." And they said, "We are witnesses." He said, "Then put away the foreign gods that are among you, and incline your hearts to the Lord, the God of Israel." The people said to Joshua, "The Lord our God we will serve, and him we will obey." So Joshua made a covenant with the people that day, and made statutes and ordinances for them at Shechem.

Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord forever. Let the grace of this Holy Communion make us one body, one spirit in Christ, that we may worthily serve the world in his name.





#### St. John's Traveler Letter:

Connecting to our siblings in Christ across the world

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Saudações - Greetings from Maputo, Mozambique. The prayers today include the province of Mozambique and Angola, which is the youngest of all the 42 Anglican Provinces. When you look at a map, you'll see that these two countries are on opposite sides of the African continent, with many countries in between, and may wonder why they are combined as a province when they aren't geographic neighbors. Their common link is that the prominent language in each is Portuguese. There are several other church provinces whose primary language is Portuguese, and these are known as the Lusophone churches. A recent gathering in Brazil of the Lusophone Network of churches stated the vision of their combined ministry in the words of Miguel de Cervantes: "A dream you dream alone is only a dream. A dream you dream together is the beginning of reality." The Communion acknowledged the combined dream of Portuguese speaking Anglicans in southern Africa and formed this province in 2021.

That gathering in Brazil of the Lusophone Network developed a creed that is poignant for the people of this beautiful but poor nation of Mozambique. I'd like to share it with you:

We believe in God:

We believe in the power of poor people,

In the audacity of those poets,

In the boldness of the prophets,

In the inspiration of the artists

We believe in Jesus,

we believe in humility to serve;

In the courage to transform,

in the joy of celebrating,

In the respect of the differences,

in the bread for the whole table,

in comfort for every sorrow.

We believe in the Spirit,

we believe in the hope of starting over;

In the beauty of the gesture of solidarity,

in fairness to all oppression,

in compassion before pain,

In love, divine-human gift. Amen.

May you and all God's people have the audacity of poets, the boldness of prophets, and the inspiration of artists.
