Dear St. John's family and friends,



We will begin in January 2024 and meet on the second Saturday of the month from 9 to 11 AM. We will have a light snack that any attendee is welcome to bring to share.






ANGEL TREE & FULTON ELEMENTARY

This is to thank everyone who played a role in this year's Bazaar. Whether you are a member of Martha's Ministry, a craftsperson or someone who contributed goods for sale, a volunteer who worked in setting up the bazaar weekend or on the weekend itself, or a buyer or donor who contributed money at the Bazaar itself, thank you for playing your part.

As you may remember, two months ago we announced a goal for the Bazaar was to raise \$5,000 for our Outreach and In-reach Ministries. This was nearly double what we had ever raised in the past. We are happy to report that not only did we exceed our expectations; we raised over \$7,000 this month.

The Martha's Ministry members had agreed in advance that rather than trying to support just one ministry, they wanted the proceeds to benefit our Outreach ministries and our ministries in support of our own members. Their goal was that 70-75% is used in support of our Outreach ministries and 25-30% be used to support ministries to our members. We would trust the Vestry in making the final call.

As successful as the event was, we still have some hard decisions to make regarding the future of the Bazaar. The members of Martha's Ministry agree that if this event is to be repeated in the future, they need a broader base of support in planning and executing the event. If any persons or groups from other ministries are willing to participate, then planning meetings will have to begin by May of next year. We need people to chair the event, set the goals and objectives for the event, and carry out the physical labor needed for the event. If we cannot find enough people for this, then the members would just as soon return to the smaller sales conducted on two Sundays.

This event was a very successful fundraiser, but we would need a broader base of support to continue and grow it in the future. If you have any interest, please contact Amy Dissinger or Deb Smith when you see them in church.



FOOD PANTRY

A Feeding Ministry Report

Our Food Pantry sees more and more need among our neighbors each month. In the last 12 months we averaged 42 visitors per week; they took home food for an average of 117 people. But in October, we averaged 53 visitors (157 household members) per week.

As we promised in November's Messenger, we now have Advent Calendar Giving Packages! The calendar shows a different suggested food for each day in Advent, and these can be stored in the accompanying package (a box or a cloth bag, your choice). If you haven't already done so, you can pick

up a calendar package at the Advent table in the atrium, before or after worship on December 3 (the first Sunday in Advent). We ask that you return the filled package any time between Christmas Eve and Epiphany.

Also, if you're eligible to receive a turkey or ham from your favorite grocery store's rewards program, please consider donating it to our food pantry; some lucky visitor will be very happy to use it! (If you bring it after hours, please place it in the freezer at the base of the stairs between the atrium and the Parish Hall.)

Thank you for your continued generosity in support of this important ministry to our neighbors!

We had a \$2.4k operating surplus in October due to booking \$21.5k of budgeted unrestricted funds as income. This is the last budgeted draw from our unrestricted account. Next month we will complete all budgeted draws from the restricted account for the year by transferring \$12.1k to operating checking.

Our YTD operating deficit is \$11k. This is considerably lower than the budgeted \$35k deficit, and we remain optimistic that we will complete the year better than budget. Notable October expenses included organ/piano repairs at \$1.3k, tree removal on Chestnut Street at \$4.8k and our annual color printing charges \$4.1k.
