SERMON

THE REV. JEN TRENARY

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. A SPECIAL WELCOME TO OUR NEW MINISTER OF MUSIC – MARK HERR

Mark is a native of Lancaster County, whose family roots go back over 300 years ago. He has been an active member of the Lancaster Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and has served as dean of the chapter twice. Ordained in the Moravian Church in 1979, Mark has served 5 different denominations throughout his years of active ministry. His Episcopal connection is from the years he lived in southern Maryland where he was involved in music and education at the historic, St. Thomas Parish, Croom, MD. In ministry, he has worked in the areas of music, education, youth and the creative arts. Mark has been the director of the Reading Liederkranz Singers (German chorus), and director of the Ephrata Cloister Chorus. For twenty years, he has been adjunct professor of philosophy, ethics and music at the Reading Area Community College. His wife Susan is a bassoonist, currently playing in the New Holland Band and the New Horizons Band in Reading. The "organ bug" hit their son Hans when he was five years old which led to him being one of the owners of R J Brunner and Associates Organ Company in Silver Spring.

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

I'm sending you Happy Mother's Day greetings from Burundi. Burundians celebrate Mother's Day every year on March 8, but every day is a good day to celebrate mothers! If you have a cup of coffee after your worship service, that may have come from here. Burundi has excellent terrain and climate for growing coffee beans. Interestingly, the harvest season here is the opposite of many of the coffee producing countries in South America, so Burundi can help supply a year-round cup of fresh joe.

Coffee production in Burundi is very much a small family farm industry. It's estimated there are more than 70,000 families growing coffee beans commercially. Agriculture is a principal lifestyle here, although there is some large scale industry, too. Burundi has rich veins of what's known as "rare earth metals," those minerals that are needed for high tech batteries, mobile phones, and computers. The nation of Burundi owns all the land and its minerals, and it contracts with several large international companies to conduct the mining operations, and many men work at those jobs.

Burundi is a beautiful country to travel and tour around. I met up with Niyokwizera Jean Claude, who's travelling the region's red dirt and gravel roads by bicycle. We've seen many people and whole families using bicycles as their main way to go from farm to village, from home to school, or just to visit friends and family. In fact, here in the Rutana province there seem to be more bicycles and small motorcycles than cars, which is a nice change from some of the large cities I've been to.

I need to sign off as I'm about to sit in with a study group for men that the Anglican Church here is sponsoring, and its focus is on creating a more positive sense of masculinity based on teachings from the Bible as a way to eliminate violence against women. That's certainly a good way to celebrate Mother's Day, wherever you are in the world.
