

With acolytes and processions, communal singing, and a mission to love and serve our neighbors, this service invites one to participate in the coming of the Kingdom.

A word about the "Mass of Creation" which we will use during October and November: Each year, the ecumenical church celebrates the "Season of Creation", culminating with the Feast of St. Francis, on October 4th. For us, the Blessing of the Animals takes place on that same day. Through the month of October, in our Sunday School classes, Adult Forums, and with the choir in worship, we remember that we are now in a "season of prayer and action" for the "protectors of our common home". Our worship will be guided by the work of Marty Haugen's "Mass of Creation", which remembers St. Francis and his ministry and through musical settings of St. Francis' prayer/poem, "All Creatures of our God and King."



The Lord spoke to Daniel in a vision and said, "At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever."

THE SECOND LESSON: Hebrews 10:11-25

Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, "he sat down at the right hand of God," and since then has been waiting "until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet." For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us, for after saying, "This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds," he also adds, "I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more." Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin. Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we

have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.





St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel to the very we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

Hello from Windhoek! This week I write to you from Namibia, which is just north of South Africa at the southern tip of the continent. It's the driest country in this part of the world, despite having a long coastline along the Atlantic Ocean. It was also the first country to have protections for the environment written into its Constitution!

Up until about 35 years ago, Namibia was part of South Africa and was ruled under a terrible system of laws called "apartheid." Under this system, a small number of white people controlled everything – the government, businesses, and schools and treated anyone not white, but especially Black people, terribly. Black people were forced to leave their homes and couldn't marry anyone who wasn't the same race. They couldn't vote and were often prohibited from traveling to certain areas of the country. It wasn't all that different from how Black people were treated here in the United States not too long ago.

Along with Nelson Mandela, who spent many years in prison for his fight against apartheid and was later elected President of a free South Africa, Anglican Bishop Desmond Tutu became one of the loudest voices opposing apartheid. While Bishop Tutu was from South Africa, he spent a lot of time here in Namibia, even after it became independent in 1990.

Thanks to President Mandela, Bishop Tutu, and other neighbors, Namibia learned from the terrible South African experience and today is a stable democracy. It goes to show you that it's never too late to avoid making the mistakes of the past – both here in Namibia, in the United States, and all over the world. We have lessons to learn from everywhere and from all people, even if we disagree with them.
