A word about the "Mass of Creation" which we will use during October and November: Each year, the ecumenical church celebrates the "Season of Creation", culminating with the Feast of St. Francis, on October 4th. For us, the Blessing of the Animals takes place on that same day. Through the month of October, in our Sunday School classes, Adult Forums, and with the choir in worship, we remember that we are now in a "season of prayer and action" for the "protectors of our common home". Our worship will be guided by the work of Marty Haugen's "Mass of Creation", which remembers St. Francis and his ministry and through musical settings of St. Francis' prayer/poem, "All Creatures of our God and King."







St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel to the very we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

Namaskāra and hello from one of the highest points in the world - Everest base camp in Nepal! When my friends told me they wanted to get closer to God this weekend, I didn't think they meant literally! Yet here we are at nearly 18,000 feet and I can see the summit of Mt. Everest, the tallest mountain in the world off in the distance. Just now I saw a Himalayan black bear cub with its mama and a single snow leopard. A couple of wolves came close to camp last night, maybe because they smelled dumplings, curries, and pizza (yes pizza!) we had last night.

Besides being a beautiful country with stunning mountains, Nepal is one of the most ethnically and religiously diverse nations in the world. While most of the people here belong to a religion called Hinduism, it's also the birthplace of Lord Buddha, the founder of Buddhism, and a small but mighty Christian community.

Earlier this week I was in the small city of Tansen, a beautiful place in the foothills that has a magnificent view of the Himalayan mountains. I was visiting the United Mission Hospital, a hospital that brings together doctors from around the world and Nepal to care for more than 100,000 patients a year. It's run by eight Christian churches and focuses not just on medical care but also education, gender equality, the environment, and working to bridge the gaps between different ethnic groups within Nepal. Because the streets can be so steep here, many people who need emergency care arrive on the back of motorcycles instead of ambulances!

In a scary world that seems to be focused more on what divides us, it was great to be in a place that brings people together to care for each other, no matter what you look like or what you believe in. I heard there's a big election this week, so make sure to look out for each other and know that we have so much more in common with our neighbors than what some people may say. Alavidā, and talk to you next week.
