

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

SERMON

THE REV. AMANDA KNOUSE

THE NICENE CREED (please rise in body or spirit)

BCP 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;


And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has pilgrims who travel to the places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares about the church and places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

Greetings to you on this first Sunday of Epiphany from Ghana in West Africa. Ghana shares a border with Togo, Burkina Faso, and the Ivory Coast, and nearly 32 million people call Ghana home. In the north, there are savannah grasslands, and, in the south, there are beaches along the Atlantic Ocean. Ghana also has six national parks full of elephants, leopards, flying squirrels, monkeys, and lions. Did you know that Ghana is home to more than 650 species of butterflies? We are in the dry season now, and the weather is pleasant and comfortable.

Ghana is one of the most prosperous countries in Africa, and there is a graceful elegance and respect here for the country's multiethnic culture. I was so surprised to learn that even though most people speak English, there are over 70 tribal languages spoken here! I have spent this week exploring the capital city of Accra, which is full of museums, libraries, traditional markets, and architecture that reflects colonial times when the British ruled Ghana. Last night, I had dinner with my new friend at his home in Osu, a neighborhood known for its supermarkets, restaurants, and pubs. We had fufu, a dish made from pounded plantains and yams with soup, and red red, a bean stew with fried plantain.

Today I worshipped at Holy Trinity Cathedral in Accra, a red-brick, Romanesque church that serves as a cultural and spiritual landmark for the Anglican Diocese of Accra. Queen Elizabeth II visited this church in 1961 and in 1999. The architecture is a blend of European design with arches vaults, and stained-glass windows adapted to Ghanian settings. The church is a focal point for community activities, education, and social gatherings. Approximately 70% of the Ghanian population are Christian.

After church, my friends took me to the Cape Coast castle. It is a white-washed castle that overlooks the sea with a sad and terrible history because slaves were held here before they left for Europe and the United States. It later served as the headquarters of the British colonial administration before Ghana, which was previously known as the Gold Coast, won its independence in 1957.

Please keep this country and its people in your prayers. Despite the growing prosperity, many Ghanians – an estimated six million – live in poverty, and unemployment and the cost of living is rising sharply. Please also pray for the traders and vendors at the Kantamanto market, one of Africa's largest second-hand clothing sites that was devastated by fire earlier this week. I will keep you in my prayers and wish you all peace and many blessings always.
