

THE FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 6:1-8 (*please be seated*)

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory."

The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

THE EPISTLE: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you--unless you have come to believe in vain.

For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them--though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

SERMON

THE NICENE CREED (please rise in body or spirit)

We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;


And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

The Parish Resource Center & CWS Lancaster are partnering with the broader community to help stop deportations in Pennsylvania - we need your help!

Many immigrants face immigration court without a lawyer. Beginning in March, we will host weekly evening legal clinics to support immigrant community members who are fighting against deportation alone. Our clinic will provide legal consultations, education to better understand immigration court and the defenses against deportation, and assistance completing and filing applications for those defenses. We'll help people apply for asylum and work on requests to get people out of immigration detention.

We need you! You don't need to have legal training or experience to volunteer. We are looking for volunteers to help with everything from interpretation and translation to childcare to assistance with document preparation. Come to a volunteer orientation to learn more about how you can help.

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

How ya goin? While that sounds like a mashup of "how are you doing" and "where are you going," it's a common greeting here in Australia. Every country and all peoples have their own expressions and slang that isn't exactly "proper" in their local language. The fact that Australians are called Aussies illustrates a common thread here. Words are abbreviated. It's not breakfast in the morning, it's brekkie. It's not the afternoon, it's (mysteriously) arvo. And famously, it's not a barbecue, it's a barbie. It's sometimes confusing, but it's also delightful.

Leaving New Zealand last week and coming here keeps me in the southern hemisphere, so we're approaching the end of Summer, which means surfing! One difference, though: New Zealanders like to point out they don't have any dangerous animals, whereas everything in Australia wants to kill you. It's somewhat of a joke, but Australia does have sharks that prowl the oceans, poisonous snakes and spiders on the land, and crocodiles that are both on the land and in the waters.

I had hoped to visit Ruth McFarland's family but am not sure I can get there due to some very serious flooding in Queensland. The northeast has endured massive amounts since last weekend. This is a vast country, and while the floods up north don't physically affect people in Melbourne in the south or Perth in the west, everyone is concerned. Please keep these folks in your prayers. They are hardy folk, so I'm confident they'll come through alright.

Enjoy your final stretch of snow and ice. I'll be thinking of you while I'm at the beach. G'day mate!
