

THE HOLY GOSPEL: John 20:19-31 (please remain standing as you are able)

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

SERMON DR. JOE PRITCHETT

Fountain of life and source of all goodness, you made all things and fill them with your blessing; you created them to rejoice in the splendor of your radiance.

Countless throngs of angels stand before you to serve you night and day; and, beholding the glory of your presence, they offer you unceasing praise. Joining with them, and giving voice to every creature under heaven, we acclaim you, and glorify your Name, as we sing,

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

We praise you, we bless you, we give thanks to you, and we pray to you, Lord our God.

Lord, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ.



St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastor Amanda,

Happy Eastertide to you and all my friends at St. John's. The sad news of the death of Pope Francis has of course spread world-wide, and it's reached the islands here. People are mourning the loss of his expressions of love and care, and also anticipating the upcoming conclave in which the next Pope will be elected. It will be interesting to watch and see how accurate the recent movie was.

The Province of the Indian Ocean includes three island nations. Madagascar is the largest, and famous as the source of most of the natural vanilla sold in the U.S. Speaking of movies, if you want a taste of what it's like for a group of Americans to land in Madagascar you can watch that Disney version of the adventure. If you like being outside in the sun and sand and crystal clear waters (you know I'll be surfing!), not to mention lush forests and waterfalls, Mauritius is as much of an island paradise as I've seen. I'm currently in Victoria, on Seychelles, though. This has the distinction of being the smallest national capital in the world, and it's delightful. St. Paul's Anglican Cathedral is also quite small, but it's a lovely sanctuary right next to the clock tower in the center of town. While it looks like a traditional island church. it was just built about 20 years ago. It was actually re-built after the first St. Paul's was so well used they decided it was time to start anew. The original settlement and Anglican congregation was established in the 1820's, and this church - well, the one that was here before this one - was a very real sanctuary when most of this town was destroyed by an avalanche in 1862. Being a small island in the middle of the Indian Ocean, there are occasional torrential rains. That year many people were left homeless, and they gathered here in the church for shelter, food, and community while they dug out from the mud that covered their homes. This church has a history of providing physical care as well as spiritual connection. It reminds me of all the community outreach and care you provide there in Lancaster. Pope Francis always focused on caring for those around us, and that's wonderful guidance to live by no matter where you or I are in the world. So, Happy Eastertide from the other side of the world on a little island in the middle of the ocean. I send you my love and care, always.
