

THE FIRST LESSON: Acts 2:1-21 (please be seated for the readings)

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: `In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' "

SERMON

BCP 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus

Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

Gluten free wafers are also available. If you are unable to come to the altar, please let an usher know and we would be happy to bring communion to you!

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastors Amanda and Joe,

I've just come in from surfing the crystal blue waters of the Toi reef at sunrise, and am writing to you from the beach on Malaita in the Solomon Islands. Malaita is one of about a thousand islands (seriously) that make up the region we call Melanesia. Many islands are surrounded by underwater coral reefs that provide excellent habitat for sea life, and epic waves for surfing. Toi is actually about 2 kilometers away from the beach, so it's a swim to get out to it, but this is a welcome respite from travel in some of the world's war-torn countries. (By the way, did you hear that Lee Jae-myung won South Korea's presidential election that I wrote about last week?) These islands are loved for their biodiversity of fish, birds, lush and flowering plants, and critters of all sizes. The plants that grow wild or have been turned into crops are especially nutritious. A staple here is poi, which is taro root that's been turned into a paste, sort of like a south pacific peanut butter. You can also find plenty of poi in Hawaii, but be sure to get it fresh from a market rather than the canned stuff sold as souvenirs for the tourists to take home in their suitcases.

The population is about 90% Christian, with a good third of that being Anglican. Church tradition, as well as native traditions and legends, run deep in local culture, and one of the local legends is of the Giants of the Solomon Islands. Native folk have told those stories for generations, and even both Japanese and American soldiers reported seeing red haired giants in the inland woods while they were here during World War II. Church tradition permeates daily life, and the church here is an active member in the Southern Cross division of the Anglican Communion.

You'll be reading this on Pentecost, which is a significant holy day here for all families. So many children! Almost half of the total population here is under the age of 19. I'm expecting lots of fun and colorful outfits in church as we pray the same prayers as you, in many different languages. Different languages, different tongues, the world over, all proclaiming faith in the risen Jesus. Happy Pentecost.
