

THE SECOND LESSON: Hebrews 11:1-3,8-16

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old-- and Sarah herself was barren-- because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **AMEN.**

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastors Amanda and Joe, and Bishop Bob:

Greetings this week from high up in the Virunga Mountains. I'm in Rwanda's Volcano National Park, with peaks upward of 15,000 feet. Diane Fosse studied endangered mountain gorillas here and, even though this is just south of the equator in Central Africa, she described the land as "so high up you shiver more than you sweat." In addition to gorillas and other primates, this area is rich in evergreen and bamboo forests, and open grasslands. It's rich in biodiversity.

As a country Rwanda is a study in conflict and recovery. You may remember the movie "Hotel Rwanda" that told the story of Paul Rusesabagina during the ethnic genocide of the mid 1990's. More than a million people died as Hutu and Tutsi neighbors attacked and killed each other. Paul provided safe shelter from violence to over 1,200 people of both tribes. And in the years following, the country, with help from the churches, conducted a wonderfully healing reconciliation program that brought people abused and their abusers together to acknowledge their differences and find what they have in common. Their reconciliation is helping Rwanda to rise from the ashes of its past.

The history of the Anglican Church of Rwanda also reflects the conflict of the country. It was founded by missionaries during a time of colonization and given the name The Province of the Anglican Church of Rwanda. In 2019 the leaders and people changed their name to remove "The Province," saying it implied being subjects of Canterbury and they seek to only be a colony of Heaven. In doing so they recognize the conflicts of their past and look to a future on common ground.

I'm about to travel down to the capital, Kigali, to see the preparations being made to host the world road cycling championships in September. The Team Rwanda bicycling team was started in 2007 to provide coaching and training resources to cyclists here, and now the country is hosting the very best cyclists in the world! The program has grown and one of its most successful athletes, Adrien Niyonshuti's story was told in another movie, "Rising from Ashes." It's definitely a good watch, and an apropos allegory for this country, its people, and our church family here, trying its best to rise from the ashes of its past.

Blessings to you, from this land of hope and promise.
