

Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. Let marriage be held in honor by all, and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled; for God will judge fornicators and adulterers. Keep your lives free from the love of money, and be content with what you have; for he has said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." So we can say with confidence,

"The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can anyone do to me?"

Remember your leaders, those who spoke the word of God to you; consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

Through him, then, let us continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely.

When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has a team of pilgrims who travel every week to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares a little bit about the church and the places he visits:

Dear Pastors Amanda, Joe, and Bishop Bob:

Abhivaadan. Greetings from Kerala, on the southwestern tip of southern India. This is sensory and spiritual overload, as I'm here at the start of Onam, the festival that celebrates the annual return of King Mahabali. He was a ruler of legend, a king of immense kindness and prosperity, banished to the underworld by Lord Vishna's avatar, but due to his love of his people was allowed to return and visit them once each year. The people gather for pageants, parades, and feasts. Onam is a festival of reunion, prosperity, and gratitude that lasts for twelve days. Close your eyes and imagine displays of giant flowers, made up of thousands of flowers. There are boat races in which massive "snake boats" with as many as 130 paddlers in each boat sprint along the river! And I just saw a parade of people all dressed as tigers, singing and dancing in the street. The central focus is the grand Shadya - neighborhood feasts, where all are welcome regardless of caste, creed, or social status. It puts into practice their belief of inclusivity, inviting all to common tables to be sure that all are fed, and all are fed equally.

The Church in South India reflects the spirit of Onam. This province is called the Church of South India (United) because it includes several different denominations: Congregational, Presbyterian, Reformed, Methodist, and Anglican. This is not a province where differences divide. There is also no effort to create a melting pot here where everyone looks, lives, loves, and worships the same. Instead, the churches and the people have created a beautiful tapestry, with the various colors of many different cultures and traditions stitched together with the love of inclusivity. It brings to mind a favorite song by Marty Haugen, "All Are Welcome."

"Let us build a house where love can dwell and all can safely live A place where saints and children tell how hearts learn to forgive

Built of hopes and dreams and visions / Rock of faith and vault of grace / Here the love of Christ shall end divisions

All are welcome, all are welcome All are welcome in this place"

It's truly refreshing to my soul to be in a place where all are welcome, at St. John's or here in Southern India. I hope your souls are refreshed as well.
