I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:


Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

# St. John's Traveler Letter:

Did you know St. John's has pilgrims who travel to the very places we pray for in the Anglican communion? Follow John as he shares about the church and places he visits:

Dear Pastors Amanda and Joe,

Nkombo from the small town of Apewoskia in Ghana! That's how you say hello in this small town in a small country in western Africa. I have a view of the vast, blue ocean just beyond a main street of bright yellow, blue, and green buildings overlooking a white sandy beach ringed by tall palm trees.

As I sit here, however, I can't ignore the fact that this view was shared by millions of people, not by choice, who passed through this town as Black slaves, about to be sent to America to work on plantations and farms. These slaves passed through the nearby Cape Coast Castle and the "Door of No Return," which, for many, was the last look at the continent on which they were born and where they called home. The collection of underground dungeons in the Castle could hold up to a thousand people, often in complete darkness, before they were forced onto ships with even worse living conditions.

Of all the disturbing things I witnessed walking through that castle – as American President Barack Obama did in 2009 – perhaps the most disturbing was the small Anglican church that existed above one of the dungeons. It is impossible to reconcile the teachings of Jesus with what went on in that Castle, yet that's what happened for hundreds of years. As the former Archbishop of Canterbury said when he visited in 2023, "It is a stain on the wider church that some Christians did not see their brothers and sisters as created in the image of God, but as objects to be exploited."

It's a burden that we all carry and one that must guide how we are called to help the poor, the homeless, and the lonely and promote peace throughout the world.
